With so much going on I'm going to keep it short this week With some bullet point reminders:

- Weekly Formative Assessment are due each Friday. Data should be used the following week to remediate instruction. Tuesday and Thursday morning meeting time should be used remediate non-Spec.Ed. Students. This is an amazing opportunity to work outside of the normal instructional window to help students succeed, and a great way to truly understand students thinking as a way to remediate learning gaps. I will send a separate email to Spec. Ed. Teachers later this afternoon since this is a relatively new initiative that has been discussed in leadership.
- The ANet Assessment window opens this week. Please make sure movment in the building is limited to what is necessary. All students must have passes in the hallway.
- This past week the Joint Discipline Subcommittee met to discuss hosting lunch detentions which would a paid opportunity for teachers. The detentions would take place on Tuesday and Thursdays during the lunch period.
   Detention would be paid at the agreed upon rate and at .75 hours a period. A 20 minute SEL lesson is part of the expectation as well as participating in PD relating to SEL and minimizing the behavior for which the student has received a detention. If you are interested in hosting detentions please email myself and CC Mr. Nagorski.
- Everyone has been doing an amazing job taking instruction to the next level and maximizing instructional time. Our scholars will benefit as a result. Thanks for all you do. Let's have a great week!

We saw a significant decrease in referrals this week. Moving into this week, make sure to
acknowledge the positive behaviors that you see from your students and praise them for meeting
expectations. The strategy Joe Gerics shared this past week is a great way to build a relationship
with a student you may be struggling with. Hold a two minute conversation with that student every
day for 10 days. Try connecting with a student that needs that support and someone in their
corner.

**Most frequent behaviors this past week**: Disruption - 12, Defiance – 8, Physical Aggression – 6 and Abusive Language - 3. We continue to see the same theme of disruption and physical aggression among our primary grades. Ensure you are using Morning Meeting time to have conversations with students about appropriate reactions to situations and provide strategies of how to handle times when they get upset and angry.

- The homeroom competition ended this past Friday. The winners will be announced on Tuesday morning.

- The next school store will be October 25th. Please post in your classroom as a reminder.

### **Curriculum and PD Updates**

- Our 2nd and 4th graders will be taking the Gifted and Talented test this week Tuesday, Wednesday
  and Thursday. This test is now computer-based so the Computer Lab will be used for it. It may affect
  Math Intervention classes prior to lunch. Ms. Naz will let you know of any location changes. Your
  flexibility is greatly appreciated.
- Some of you have received an invite for an ELL strategy workshop to be held this Monday at 8:15 am in the Media Center. Kathybel Ortiz, who replaced Sam Roman as our Network ELL partner, will be presenting on various strategies to help our scholars. Hope to see you there!
