Most frequent behaviors this past week: 7 Disruption, 4 Fighting & 2 Physical Aggression We continue to see disruption and physical aggression as common infractions. Disruption of the learning environment cannot be tolerated but it is also important to ensure that students are engaged so that disruption is not occurring. We also want to ensure that our interactions with our students do not increase the disruption. Always remember to redirect privately when possible and try to use a calm voice. For a student that you believe is not responding to Tier I supports, consider starting a behavior contract with the student. If you have a student that you have concerns with, please reach out to Mrs. Beets to discuss other interventions and supports.
