We consistently identify the common misbehaviors and strategies to remedy it. However, we need to drill into our data more and identify trends we see. Below is the comparison between male and female students as well as our subgroups from the beginning of the year.

How do we respond to our data? When students make bad choices and misbehave consequences are issued; however, we need to also look at interventions. How are we intervening before writing a detention slip or a referral? Are we using Tier I interventions such as holding a private conversation with the student or giving them a break?
