Please make sure a referral is submitted to Mrs. Beets when a student is removed from the class. If it is something urgent and they need to be removed immediately, make sure you follow up later with the referral. You can also send a detailed note. It is extremely important that Mrs. Beets knows what the infraction was and Ms. Bircher needs to know in order to work with the student.

Reminders for PBIS implementation:

- · State the expectations for each activity and transition. Do not just assume that because it is April that students know what is expected of them.
- · Avoid power struggles with students and do not take behavior personal.
- · When redirecting do so in a calm manner and privately when you can.
- · Praise students. Acknowledge when students are meeting expectation.

In addition to the PBIS reminders above I wanted to share a Relationship Building strategy I recently learned about. During a recent training on "Trauma- Informed Practices," a Humanware representative gave a strategy called the 2 x 10 Technique. Identify your most challenging students right now. Find their likes and interests by engaging them in a 2-minute conversation every day for 10 days. Although we are at the end of the year, it is never too late to build relationships with students.
