The article provides 4 ways to deal with classroom disruptions, they identify 4 reminders when working with disruptive students that is powerful:

- All behavior happens for reason.
- Avoid becoming defensive of a child's behavior
- Change the mindset
- Maintain student dignity

A classroom teacher's job is challenging enough to ensure students are academically successful and then behavior management adds an extra layer. Although we cannot control the factors that contribute to our students' misbehavior, we can control our mindset and how we react to the misbehaviors.
