Student Attendance

Remote Learning Guidelines for Families One of the most important ways that families and caregivers can partner with schools on strong student attendance during remote learning is to ensure that the school has accurate and up-to-date contact information on file:

- Email addresses that are least likely to change during the school year
- Phone number
- Address (if you have moved please update with school secretary)



Parent's Responsibilities - Attendance

- Continue to call students off at the school's main phone line when your child will be absent from remote learning for the day.
- Communicate with teachers when your child is unable to attend the live lesson but will attend the recorded session. Students are considered present when they watch the recorded lesson as directed by the teacher.
- Let the teacher or a school team member know if you experience difficulties that prevent your child from logging into school.
- Create a routine schedule during school hours to make it easier for your child to learn and study.
- Explain to your children that both Synchronous (Teacher led) Asynchronous (Student- led, independent) learning count toward their attendance.

Your score report will suggest AP courses that are a great match for you. AP can give you an edge in the admission process, and an opportunity to earn college credit.

Special Education

- Special Education is a continuum of services and supports designed for children who have disabilities that impact their academic performance.
- While the District is in Remote Learning, all special education services will be delivered remotely and through teletherapy services. The services in your child's IEP will be implemented through virtual/remote means.
 - In-person services will resume once it is safe to do so.
 - You can request an IEP meeting at any time to discuss your child's remote services.
- IEP and ETR meetings will be held virtually or via telephone. If neither of these methods works for you, please speak with your child's Intervention Specialist.
- If you suspect your child may have a disability, please communicate this to your child's teacher or school Principal (preferably in writing).
 - The School Psychologist and Student Support Team (SST) will convene a meeting with you
 within 30 days to discuss your concerns and respond.

Project Act – Homeless Services

- Project ACT provides direct instructional and support services to children and youth residing in temporary emergency shelters, transitional housing and doubled-up students staying with other families due to loss of housing, economic hardship or similar situations.
- A holistic and comprehensive approach is used to deliver instructional and support services necessary to facilitate the homeless child's transition into school, and to ensure the child's success and ongoing participation in the educational system.
- Support services include everything necessary to accomplish the goal of meeting students' physical, social and emotional needs, and empowering parents to support their children in this endeavor. All appropriate resources from the Cleveland Metropolitan School District are employed to achieve this goal.

What is the purpose of Title IA - ESSA?

(ESSA – Every Student Succeeds Act) Family Engagement Federal Funding

To inform parents of their rights and roles within their scholar's school building as it relates to:

- Being included in decision making opportunities and committees regarding school improvement plans
- Participating in school-based parent organizations (SPO/PAC/PCO, etc.)
- Providing input on how Title IA Family Engagement funds are spent to support meaningful engagement activities which advance student achievement
- Ensuring that the school engages in two-way communication with parents to strengthen family/school partnerships
- Removing barriers to participation (time of day, child-care, translation services, accommodations for special needs, transportation, etc.)

Parents' Right to Know -Title IA - ESSA

Parents have the right to know about the teaching qualifications of their child's classroom teacher in a school receiving Title I funds. You can request this information from your principal.

- Notification if your child is being taught for 4 or more weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified.
- Whether the teacher has met state qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived
- Whether the teacher is teaching in the field of discipline of certification of the teacher
- Whether your child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications



How can I support Title IA Programs?


- Participate in the SPO (School Parent Organization) or Parent Advisory Committee
