School Goals

Priority #1 Literacy Reading: Daily Writing and speaking grounded in evidence from texts, both literary and informational (with students having frequent opportunities to practice writing in all three genres: narrative, opinion and informative). Priority #2: Facilitate meaningful mathematical discourse. They will demonstrate to parents what scholars are learning in class, math concepts and activities to support at home practice. Our school will share student achievement updates during virtual and in person parent teacher conferences, phone calls and reports sent home with students. We will hold a Math and Science Night: Grade levels will work together to create an activity aligned with their standards.

The Classroom

Parents are welcome to volunteer in classrooms and cafeteria upon request. They will be allowed to come for special classroom events (e.g. field trips, classroom plays, special programs and other socials events. At Home

Parents and families will support scholars learning by:

- Monitoring attendance (virtual and in person)

- Making sure that homework is completed.
- Promoting positive use of scholar's extracurricular time
- Staying informed about scholar's education and communication with the school by promptly reading all notices from the school or the school district
- Participate in parent teacher conferences and other events.

Scholars

Do homework every day and ask for help when needed.

Read at least 30 minutes every day outside of school time.

Take care of and be responsible for any technology needed to stay fully engaged in virtual instruction.
