My name is Ricardo Newell, and I serve as the Family Support Specialist for Say Yes Cleveland here at Waverly. As you may know, Say Yes Cleveland provides two things for Cleveland students: support services in school and tuition scholarships to college or career training.

Here, at Waverly, students and parents are also elibile to receive free legal services, free health services, emergency food services, and clothing vouchers through Say Yes Cleveland. Likewise, students are eligible to receive free integrated health services, which makes it easy for children to access mental, dental, and physical care. In efforts to ensure that these resources are continuously made available, we kindly ask parents to complete the Say Yes survey. The Say Yes survey is a confidential way to let us know how to support your scholar and family. Their student's ID# is needed. This can be found on their report card, or you can contact me directly and I get it to you. The Survey can be accessed by taking a picture of the QR code at the bottom of the page or by simply logging onto sayyscleveland.org.






