### How your scholar can get involved at John Marshall:

- Join a sports team

### Career & College Readiness

Our top focus at JMSOE is to expose your scholar to career & college readiness programs. Scholars will have the opportunity throughout the year to meet with various college representatives from schools all across the state, both large and small. As well as meet with various professionals in industries ranging from engineering to medical. It is our hope that scholars find their next career path while being exposed to these experiences.

In the fall, we hosted a college fair in conjunction with our College Now department. Scholars were able to meet one on one with college representatives. In the spring, we will host a career fair during Engineering Week. Professionals from all technical fields will be present.

### Graduation Requirements for Class of 2022

Take and earn a state minimum of 22 credits in specific subjects. You also must receive instruction in economics and financial literacy and complete at least two semesters of fine arts.

1. **Ohio's State Tests.**
2. **Industry credential and workforce readiness**
3. **College admission test**

### Partner Programs



The mission of MAGNET, the Manufacturing Advocacy & Growth Network, is to support, educate and champion manufacturing in Ohio with the goal of transforming the region's economy into a powerful, global player.

#### Early College Early Career

Developed by MAGNET in conjunction with other organizations, the Early College Early Career program takes students from high school and guides them through a college degree program and subsequent manufacturing career to meet the needs of manufacturers in Northeast Ohio. This initiative offers students company-based, real-world training as well as certification programs that can result in the skilled workforce needed for the region's manufacturing sector.

Cohort 1 started Fall 2017 with students going into their junior year. Cohort 2 started Fall 2018. Cohort 3 continued in Fall 2019 and is currently in its 5<sup>th</sup> year.
