The Ohio Department of Education has requested that we share this Notice of Proposed Class Action Settlement with you as part of a proposed settlement of a lawsuit involving the Ohio Department of Education. Although CMSD is not named in the lawsuit, the goal of the Settlement Agreement is to improve the overall quality of special education and related services given to students with disabilities across the State, and, in particular, in 11Districts of which CMSD is one, and to improve results for students with disabilities. It includes additional support by ODE so that school districts, particularly the 11 Districts identified, meet the requirements of federal law. School board approves plan for programs, facilities

The Cleveland Board of Education has approved a plan for the future of District academic programs and facilities. The board voted 9-0 on Nov. 19 to adopt the plan after the District spent months holding community meetings and collecting feedback. **At CEO Eric Gordon's request**, the board postponed for at least a year a proposal to close Collinwood High School and include it in the consolidation with Glenville and Martin Luther King Jr. He also withdrew a recommendation to phase out and close New Tech West High School.

Neighborhood leaders had protested the recommendation to close Collinwood, which once held more than 3,000 students but now has barely more than 200. Gordon called on them to form a Friends of Collinwood High School group that will, among other things, help develop a manufacturing pathway to train students for high paying, in-demand jobs. He also is asking them to drive efforts to recruit and retain students and find users who will fill excess space and help restore the building to status as a neighborhood anchor. Read More...

It's time to choose a high school!


Choice season is under way at CMSD. Students and their families can select high schools for next school year by visiting ChooseCMSD.org.

Most students will begin the 2020-21 school year on Monday, Aug. 17, 2020, under a calendar approved by the Board of Education. Year-round schools will begin classes on Monday, July 27 for ninth-graders and Tuesday, July 28 for 10th - through 12th-graders. Most students will end the school year on Thursday, May 27. Students in some schools on an extended year will finish on Monday, June 7, except for the Cleveland School of Science and Medicine and Cleveland School of Architecture and Design, which will finish on Friday, June 18.
