Tips For Keeping Your Child Safe Online

What Youth Do Online May Surprise You Source refrenced by Clayton Weeks on February 19, 2019

- 1. Have a conversation with your child. Warn them about a dangerous websites, and sex offenders. Do not lecture your child. Let your child know you're looking out for them, speak honestly, listen, and ask questions about their usage. Remind them not to share personal information online such as phone number, address, school name, their friends or family information too.
- 2. Keep your computer and have
- your chld use their cell phone/chrome book in a common area of the house. It is more difficult for sex offenders and oline bullies to harass your child when you can see what your child is up to. So make sure your kids aren't going to bed with their laptops and phones. Keep internet time in the common areas.
- 3. Set-rules-and stick to them. As parent/guardian, it's your job to limit your kid's screen time, set
- screen time, set boundaries for inapproriate content, and make sure your child stick to them. Talk to your internet service provider about filters you can use to block pornographic or violent websites, or invest in a Wi-Fi router with parental controls.
- 4. Watch for changes in behavior and receiving gifts from anyone. Youth being secretive and withdrawn could be a sign that something is going on




- 5. Never allow your child upload or download photos without your permission. Online predators will often requst pictures of your child or send pictures of themselves.
