

SY2021-2022 CMSD GUIDANCE DOCUMENT for Ohio Third Grade Reading Guarantee (TGRG) Reading

Intervention and Monitoring Plans (RIMPs).

Each year, districts and schools must administer the reading diagnostic by Sept. 30 for grades 1-3 and Nov. 1 for kindergarten to determine whether a child is on track or not on track in reading. Our district administers the NWEA reading diagnostic in the fall for grades 1 through 3 for the 2021-2022 school year, and aimswebPlus for Kindergarten from the state-approved list of assessments. The results of the Sept. 30 and Nov. 1 reading diagnostic tests determine if the child is on track at the beginning of each grade for reading at the level set by Ohio's Learning Standards for the end of the previous grade.

- For example, a third-grader is on track in reading if the child's fall reading diagnostic shows that he or she is reading at the level of end of grade 2.
- A student is not on track if he or she is not reading at the beginning of each grade at the level set by Ohio's Learning Standards for the end of the previous grade.

The following table outlines the reading cut scores used by our district to determine if a child is on-track or off-track for reading as well as the assessment windows for the 2021-2022 school year.

• Please note that a scaled score of 194 on the NWEA or a scaled score of 683 OST (or subscore 46) allows the student to be promoted to 3rd grade in the next calendar year (this promotion score only needs to be reached once by the student to be promoted the next calander year to 4th grade).

Reading Diagnostic

The Reading Diagnostic, also known as a screener, must be administered by September 30 each year for grades 1-3 and November 1 for Kindergarten to measure whether a student is on-track or not on-track for reading at grade level (i.e., being measured as proficient on the state reading test) according to the previous year's end-of-year standards.

*RIT scores are the lowest possible score associated with the "On-Track" (i.e. Kindergarten student scores a 15 or lower on the aimswebPlus early literacy score or composite during Fall administration would be placed in a RIMP)

*Although the TGRG requirements have been modified by the Ohio Department of Education for the 2021-2022 school year, schools are still required to create, implement and track Reading Improvement and Monitoring Plans for students who are not on track in reading in grades K-3.

This table identifies the NWEA cut scores to be used for each grade level and benchmark throughout the 2021-2022 school year for Cleveland Metropolitan School District. Reading growth plans for grades 1-10 should be developed for each grade using the scores identified. *(For TGRG cut scores and RIMP guidance see page 1 of this document.)* Although grade 3 promotion follows the state recommended cut score of 194 NWEA, we are encouraging school teams to monitor and set targets for the goal towards developing proficiency as outlined in our internal District alignment with OST and NWEA. Please note that the NWEA cut-scores for Spring should be met to predict proficiency on the Spring OST. The Fall and Winter cut-scores are a guide to whether the students are on-track to be proficient in our internal District alignment with OST and NWEA.

This table identifies the NWEA cut scores to be used for each grade level and benchmark throughout the 2021-2022 school year throughout the Cleveland Metropolitan School District for math. These scores were determined based on internal District alignment with the OST and NWEA. Please note that the NWEA cut-scores for Spring should be met to predict proficiency on the Spring OST. The Fall and Winter cut-scores are just a guide, but the ultimate goal is to reach the grade level score in Spring since the Winter and Fall cut-scores are not true grade level proficiency. The Fall and Winter cut-scores are a guide to whether the students are on-track to be proficient.
