What is True2U CollegeBound?

It's a virtual, small group mentoring program that helps students further develop their interests, strengths, goals and build upon their leadership skills as they navigate through high school. Students will be matched with a current Cleveland State University Student Mentor for mentoring and personal development guidance during eight Saturday sessions.

Each session will feature engaging icebreakers, group activities, thought-provoking discussions and small group mentoring that will prepare students for their next steps beyond high school and set them on a path of success in college and career readiness.

An experience at Cuyahoga Community College next summer, participation stipend, and a scholarship opportunity will round out the experience.

Session themes include self-identity, relationship-building, healthy decision-making and money management, to name a few.

Schedule

Sessions will take place one or two Saturdays each month from 10 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. and will be facilitated by program staff.

Location - It's Virtual

Sessions will be conducted virtually – this means you can participate from the comfort of your own space! For each session, participants are strongly encouraged to occupy a private space where they can actively listen and speak with minimal distraction. For productive participation in this virtual program, participants will be required to have the necessary technology in addition to some other resources. This includes:

- Device (i.e. laptop/desktop, tablet/iPad, smartphone, etc.)
- Wi-Fi Access (strong internet connection)
- Built-in camera or external webcam
- Microphone and speaker capabilities
- Headphones/Headset (recommended but not required)
