

School Parent and Family Engagement Policy School Year 2024-2025

The Classroom

Families can volunteer to support instruction in the classroom, on field trips or other ways that are mutually beneficial.

Teachers will communicate with families, opportunities to support learning, through Seesaw and Schoology as well as text and emails.

Parents will have accounts for two-way communication through Remind, Class Dojo, and Pikmykid.

At Home

Families can support by:

Sending scholars to school every day who are well.

Consistently reviewing school website and social media

Creating a schoolwork space at home

Making sure that contact information is current

Promoting positive use of scholar's extracurricular time

Staying informed about their scholar's education and communication with the school by promptly reading all notices from the school or the school district

Scholars

Scholars should do their homework every day and ask for help when needed.

Read at least 30 minutes every day outside of school time and participate in asynchronous learning opportunities.

Attend and participate in instruction and use individualized learning pathways like iReady.

Show responsibility for their assigned technology needed to stay fully engaged in instruction.

Take home all notices and information received from school and give to parent or guardians.
