SCHOOL CALENDAR TRANSITION, SCHOOL YEAR 2025-26

Dear CMSD Families and Staff:

CMSD's Board of Education voted yesterday to approve the CEO's recommendation to unify all schools on one academic calendar. This change will go into effect in the fall, with the beginning of the 2025-2026 school year. The first day of school will be August 18, 2025, for all schools. Start and dismissal times are included as an attachment. The only exceptions to this unified calendar are the School of One and the Downtown Education Center (DEC), which will continue to operate on an extended calendar.

Previously, CMSD schools have operated on five different calendars. The majority, 71 schools, have been on a traditional, August-through-May calendar, but 24 schools operated on one of four different extended-year, year-round, and/or extended-minute calendars.

For most of our schools, this decision will not change their school year at all. However, a minority of schools, including the school attended by your child, will transition away from an extended school year or year-round calendar to a traditional, August-May school calendar.

While we recognize any change can be difficult for some, the decision to unify the district under one calendar will have multiple benefits for our District. We recognize and celebrate the high performance of the scholars in all our schools. We believe that the unique programming of the extended-year and year-round schools can and will be continued and accommodated within a traditional school calendar and day, including internships, tutoring, robotics, intervention, guest speakers, extracurricular activities, field trips, and more.

Thank you, and we look forward to seeing your scholar on the first day of the next school year, August 18, 2025.
