The Classroom

Teachers will have virtual office hours that will be posted on their Schoology page. Teachers will also use their virtual office hours to inform students as well as parents about their scholars' goals and academic progress.

Two-way communication will be used during teachers' office hours. Teachers will call parents and parents will also have opportunities to call teachers during scheduled office hours.

At Home

- Monitoring attendance.

- Information will be uploaded on school website to inform parents as needed.

Scholars
