Nice work getting scholars off to a strong start! Here are a few instructional and PBIS reminders for the upcoming week.

Academic:

- Lesson plans will be reviewed this week. Please make sure they are accessible.
- Walk-throughs this week will focus on clear objectives detailed in plans and written as I can statements somewhere in the room.
- Writing should be occurring daily and writing tasks should be in response to text.
- All students should be engaged in some form of complex text for the majority of all lessons.
- Begin goal setting with students as soon as possible.
 Celebrate successes on prior years OST. Remember to maintain a data binder that includes student goals and data pertinent to your grade and content area
- Closely monitor students in the lowest 20th percentile who are not receiving any kind on intervention or support. Be prepared to refer to SST if you are not seeing progress.
- All instruction is aligned to the ANet Scope and Sequence. This will be a look for in walkthroughs.
- Intervention Specialist lesson plans should share the same objectives as gen. ed., but should be scaffolded to meet the needs of scholars per their IEP.

Behavior:


- Redirect off stage. Sometime proximity and a hand on a desk can be enough.
- Do not ask a student "Why are you.....?". Instead give clear directives that restate what you want them to be doing.
- Continue focusing on establishing strong routines and procedures as instruction ramps up. The expectation is that standards based instruction is in full swing.
 Continue to teach and review procedures while delivering content.
- Review CFL data for your grade level. Review the question stems included in the report. Target areas in need of improvement and discuss during morning meeting.

As you know from our discussions at our 1st staff meeting, our goals for this year as they relate to SEL, are to increase each of the four components by 3 points until we get to 100%. Take a look at the data above and begin to think about how you will move these metrics in your particular grade level. I will share the details of each metric as focal points in the upcoming weeks. Just an FYI: Per our CBA it is mandatory that we use Paths, 2nd Step, or another research based SEL curriculum as part of our PBIS. I will be ensuring that we have materials in the upcoming weeks and that everyone is provided training. More information will be forth coming. Thanks.



We had a great first week back! Setting expectations and reminding students of expectations was evident around the building. Continue to remind students of what is expected of them through the S.O.A.R. acronym. Ms. Herbele referred to S.O.A.R. during the Kindergarten meeting in a catchy way for students to remember: "Scholars are Organized, Accountable and Respectful."

- Setting expectations and acknowledging students for making the right choice is a big part of our PBIS
 program but we also have to be prepared of how to respond when students do not meet expectation.
 PBISWorld is a great resource for Tier I interventions. A few points to highlight:
 - Redirect privately
 - Avoid power struggles.
 - Praise when on task.
- Cardinal Store and Cardinal Competition
 - The first Cardinal Competition will be on August 30th. Continue to acknowledge homerooms displaying S.O.A.R. behavior by passing out Cardinal Competition points.
 - The Cardinal Store will be open on August 30th. Please write the date on the board for your students.

- We are still waiting for Studies Weekly materials to arrive. They are supposed to be en route.
- Aimsweb Plus Benchmarking begins today for all K-3 students. The window closes on Friday, September 6th. I will keep you updated as to when your students will be benchmarked for grades 1-3.


