As we return for the 2nd semester, this is a great opportunity to reset your classroom. Maybe you are not happy with how transitions have been or maybe classroom expectations were starting to slip. You have a second chance to set the tone and set expectations for the 2nd half of the year. Reflect on what went well during the first half of the year and what needs to be improved. When resetting your classroom, be transparent with the students of why changes are being made or why expectations need to be reviewed. Specifically stating expectations for students and acknowledging when they are meeting them is a big part of PBIS. Also remember that when misbehavior does occur, our reactions to the situation are very important. Can a disruptive behavior be ignored for a bit? Will a nonverbal cue or proximity help deter the behavior? When possible redirecting privately is the best way to address the behavior while not embarrassing the student and taking a chance of the behavior escalating.
