I hope everyone had a relaxing holiday. This week our instructional walk through focus will be on student work and the amount, quality, and timeliness of feedback. Remember, there is no substitute for understanding and responding to individual and group misconceptions.

In preparation for OELPA Testing beginning February 2, make sure you have received the OELPA test rubrics from your ELL students. The expectations is that you are including additional vocabulary support in your plans. ELL students should be given extra opportunities to speak in small groups, pairs, and in response to questions. A best practice is to include these strategies in your plans. There is no better time than now to try a new discourse strategy;)

Our Math focus this week is conceptual understanding. Conceptual understanding is 1 of the 3 aspects of rigor. How are you identifying and addressing conceptual understanding in your lessons? What strategies best serve the development of conceptual understanding? These are great topics of discussion for your PLCs and will be included in our upcoming agendas.

Our ELA focus this week will be on the design and administration of text dependent questions. We've been doing a great job on putting complex text in front of scholars, now let's increase the rigor by using the DOK charts to create engaging and aligned text dependent questions.

Lastly, continue to use your analysis of the recently released CFL results to target areas of improvement and set goals around these metrics.

We continue to see disruption has a common infraction among our students. We have to remember that students are impulsive and do not often think of consequences before making choices. A big part of PBIS is not ignoring negative behaviors but specifically stating expectations. There are still consequences for misbehavior with PBIS but it is important that we utilize different strategies to help students improve their behavior. A couple of reminders when dealing with disruption are: 1) Stay calm and emotion free. Avoid yelling because that will often escalate the situation. 2) Listen carefully to students. Often times we may have missed what caused them to be disruptive in the first place. 3) Remove the audience. When at all possible, have a conversation with a student in private and avoid publicly redirecting them in front of their peers. 4) Make a parent contact and set up meeting to discuss the concerns.

### **PBIS Updates Cont.:**

- Our OELPA Informational Meeting this past Wednesday was successful in getting ELL students in the mindset of what to expect when taking the OELPA. We are currently in the process of reviewing students' data with them, as well as giving the practice tests. I'm not going to lie – helping Ms. Vega with this task has been a real eye opener. The expectations for students are high and it is a tedious process to move through the 4 domains of Reading, Writing, Speaking and Listening. More detailed student data will be reviewed on Wednesday so that we can better prepare our students. The testing window will open on Monday, February 3rd.
- An updated ELL schedule will be distributed once we are done reviewing their data.

### Other testing dates to keep in mind:

- ANet A3 will take place from March 2-4
- ELA OST will be from April 2 24
- Math and Science OST will be from April 20 May 8
- Winter Benchmarking for our K-3 students in Aimsweb Plus continues and will run the whole month of January.
- PD this week will be a TDES presentation, as well as a Staff Meeting. Afterwards, we will break out into our K-3, Math and ELA PLC's.
