



Dismissal Safety Reminder

Morning Drop Off

Please see the following:



- Do not park in the staff lot, unless there is an available
 parking spot. If dropping your child off, you must find a legal street zone to park in.
 Blocking teacher cars and illegally parking in the lot will not be tolerated. In the case of an emergency, vehicles would not be able to enter our lot. Please adhere to these rules!
- Starting on Monday, all parents must use the Montrose Main entrance and report to the
 office to sign in. No parents will be permitted to use the Glencliff Ave entrance. All
 parents must drop their children off at the cafeteria doors.

Afternoon Dismissal

Please see the following:

- When picking up your child, please <u>DO NOT</u> direct them to walk in front of cars or in between cars in order to get in vehicles.
- Please ensure you are parked along the curb when picking up your child. This is for the safety of all of our students and families.
- If picking up on the Glencliff side, all cars must be parked in legal spots and walk to get your children
- All students MUST use the crosswalk. Please do not direct your child to cross in the middle of the street

The goal of our dismissal is to get all students home safely in a timely fashion. When cars stop in the middle of the road waving students to get in the car this poses serious safety concerns. Please follow our dismissal guidelines and expectations.
