FAQs on SNAP Emergency Allotment Ending

We know customers may have questions for you about their Emergency Allotments ending after the February payments are made. Below are some common questions and answers you can share with customers:

Q: What is an Emergency Allotment?

- The Emergency Allotment was the second SNAP payment loaded on to the Ohio Direction Card near the end of each month, separate from the monthly standard benefit payment received earlier in the month determined by income and expenses.
- *(If you are assisting a customer and you have verified their identity and have their case open, you can share the specific impact on their case. Otherwise, you can provide the general information in the next bullet)*
- The emergency allotment would be loaded in one of two ways:
 - Families who were not receiving the maximum benefit received the difference between their standard benefit and the maximum benefit for their household size.
 - Families who were already in receipt of the maximum benefit or within \$95 of the difference between their standard amount and the maximum benefit for their household size received an additional \$95 supplement.

Q: When is the last Emergency Allotment payment made?

The last Emergency Allotment payment will be made at the end of February 2023. Beginning in March 2023, customers will only receive their standard benefit payment on their regular load date.

Q: Why has the Emergency Allotment ended?

In December 2022, the U.S. Congress passed the [2023 Consolidated Appropriations Act](#), a spending bill for the 2023 fiscal year that does not provide further funding for Emergency Allotments.

Q: Can I request a hearing about the loss of the Emergency Allotment?

Neither the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services, nor Cuyahoga Job and Family Services, have control over this change. Because this is a federal law change, there are no fair hearing rights or fair hearing benefits on the ending of the SNAP emergency allotments.

Q: How do I know what my standard allotment is?

- Your standard SNAP benefit amount is determined by your household income and expenses. If you have different income or expenses to report, please submit verification of these to CJFS.
- **To check the standard allotment:** Customers who want to check their standard benefit amount, can call the Ohio Direction Card Customer Service Center at 1-866-386-3071 or visit the Self-Service Portal at ssp.benefits.ohio.gov.

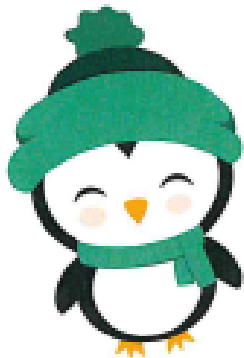

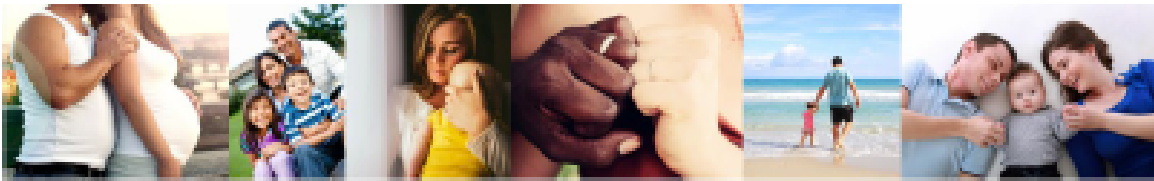

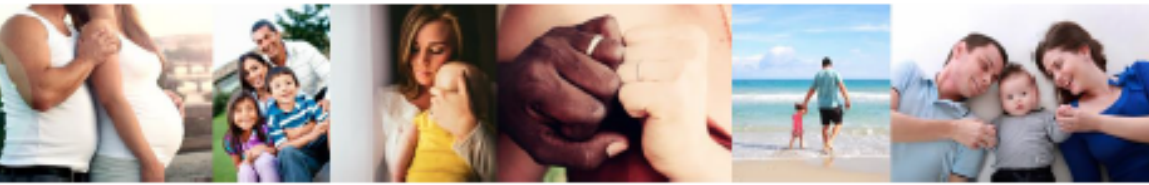

Log in at benefits.ohio.gov or call your local agency.

2

Open your mail

Read any letters you get from the Ohio Department of Health to find out how changes will affect you.

3

Take action

Don't miss key deadlines. The letters will tell you what you need to do to get continued benefits.

During the COVID-19 public health emergency (PHE), you have been able to keep your coverage regardless of any changes in your circumstances.

Use the simplified Child Tax Credit
Sign-Up Tool to get up to \$3600 per child!

What is the expanded Child Tax Credit?

To help families meet their children's basic needs, Congress expanded the Child Tax Credit (CTC) for 2021. Families will receive a total of \$3,600 per child up to age 5 and \$2,400 per child 6 to 17.

This credit will not affect your Medicaid, SNAP/Food stamps, TANF Cash Assistance, SSI, or other public benefits.

Is My Child Eligible for the CTC?

To be eligible, children must:

- ✓ Have a Social Security Number.
- ✓ Live with you for at least half of the year.
- ✓ Be under age 18 as of December 31, 2021.

How do I get Signed Up?

If you haven't filed taxes recently and if your income is below \$12,550 (under \$25,100 for a married couple) you can sign up at the link below!

Had a baby in 2020 or 2021?

You could get up to \$5,000 in federal money for your baby. **(\$3600 with the Child Tax Credit plus a \$1400 stimulus payment)**



Getting this money does not impact your immigration status or the status of people you live with.

- ✓ You could also get other payments for yourself and any other children you have.
- ✓ You can get this money even if you have never done taxes before or if you have not in the last few years.
- ✓ This money does not count for most benefits, like SNAP, WIC, TANF, MEDICAID, CHIP, SSI, Emergency Assistance shelter, and most types of public and subsidized housing.
- ✓ If you didn't get the 2020 stimulus payments for a baby born in 2020 (\$500 for the first payment and \$600 for the second), you can get these by filing a late or amended 2020 tax return.

Customer Assistance Resources

CLEVELAND PUBLIC UTILITIES

The City of Cleveland Department of Public Utilities (DPU) is committed to providing our customers with reliable and affordable utility services. The three divisions of DPU – Cleveland Water, Water Pollution Control, and Cleveland Public Power – work hard to keep water and energy services affordable for all our customers. We know that's not always enough, though. That's why we offer customer assistance programs to help with the cost of bills and other utility-related expenses.

WATER & SEWER ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

Eligible customers can apply for one of the two following assistance programs that offer a discounted Cleveland Water and/or Water Pollution Control bill.

Homestead Discount Program

The Homestead Discount Program offers lower water and sewer rates for eligible Cleveland Water and Water Pollution Control customers. To qualify, customers must meet the following criteria:

- Be 65 years of age or older, or totally and permanently disabled;
- Own and live at the service address; and
- Meet income guidelines.

To enroll in the Homestead Discount Program, customers must complete and submit an application. Once enrolled, the program eligibility period is good for 3 years, after which a renewal application is required. Discounted rates apply to both Cleveland Water and Water Pollution Control rates.

Water Affordability Program

The Water Affordability Program, administered by CHN Housing Partners, offers a 40% discount on water bill charges to Cleveland Water customers who meet income guidelines.

Upon qualifying, a monthly discount is applied to water and sewer bills for one full year. Re-verification of income is required each year to maintain eligibility.

Low-Income Household Water Assistance (LIHWAP)

LIHWAP is a temporary program available to help low-income families experiencing hardship with water and sewer bills, particularly those who have been disconnected or are facing disconnection.

Customers with a household income at or below 175% of the federal poverty guidelines are eligible to receive a one-time benefit of up to \$750 for water bills and \$750 for sewer bills.

ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

Winter Crisis Assistance

The Winter Crisis Program runs from November 1st through March 31st each year. Eligible households in emergency situations may qualify to receive up to \$175 per heating season in payment assistance to households who are at or below 175% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines. This is a one-time benefit to help customers who have been disconnected or are facing disconnection maintain, restore, transfer, or initiate their energy utility services.

Summer Crisis Assistance

The Summer Crisis Program helps eligible customers with payment of an electric bill or the purchase of a fan or air conditioning unit. Program benefits are available once per cooling season to households who are at or below 175% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines, have a household member age 60 or older, and/or a household member with a documented medical condition requiring air conditioning. The program duration is typically from July 1 through August 31.

Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP)

The HEAP Program provides a one-time benefit to income eligible households to help with home energy bills. It is applied as a direct credit to your CPP account. The amount of this benefit varies and is dependent upon federal funding levels, how many people live with you, and total household income. HEAP offers assistance twice a year as outlined below. Eligibility for one program does not guarantee benefits from both programs.

HOME REPAIR PROGRAMS

Cleveland Water, Water Pollution Control, and CPP offer home repair and weatherization services via CHN Housing Partners' Home Energy Efficiency Services Program.

Services are available to renters and homeowners to help with water conservation, plumbing repair, water heater repair or replacement, insulation, heating system repair or replacement, appliance replacement, and more. All improvements are provided based on income qualifications and a home energy inspection.

Prevention, Retention, and Contingency Program COVID-19 Emergency Assistance

Emergency Assistance is temporarily available for families affected by COVID-19, through the Prevention, Retention, and Contingency (PRC) program with Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) funding. While limited funding is available, individuals meeting eligibility requirements may receive funds to help meet essential needs in the form of a voucher.

To be eligible for a COVID-19 PRC voucher, the following criteria must be met:

- Must be a family assistance group that includes a minor child, or a pregnant individual, or a non-custodial parent of a minor child receiving Ohio Works First (OWF), Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and/or Medicaid.
- At least one member of the assistance group must be a U.S. citizen or a qualified alien.
- Must be a Cuyahoga County resident.
- Gross monthly income of the assistance group must be at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines (FPG).
- Liquid assets greater than \$1000 must be used to meet the current need.

Categories of assistance through the COVID-19 PRC include:

- **Supplemental Food Assistance:** Maximum amount based on assistance group size (1 person=\$194, 2 people=\$355, etc.).
- **Essential Supplies:** Items such as cleaning products, daily care, infant care items, etc. Maximum amount for a family with minor children is \$200. Maximum amount for a pregnant woman or non-custodial parent is \$150.
- **Housing Assistance:** Maximum amount is \$750.

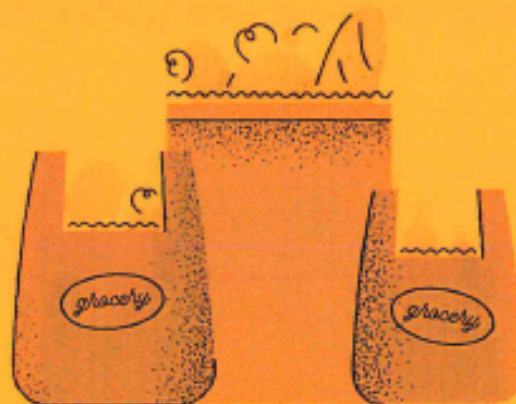

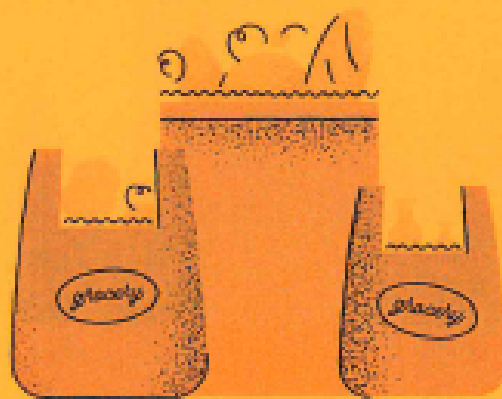

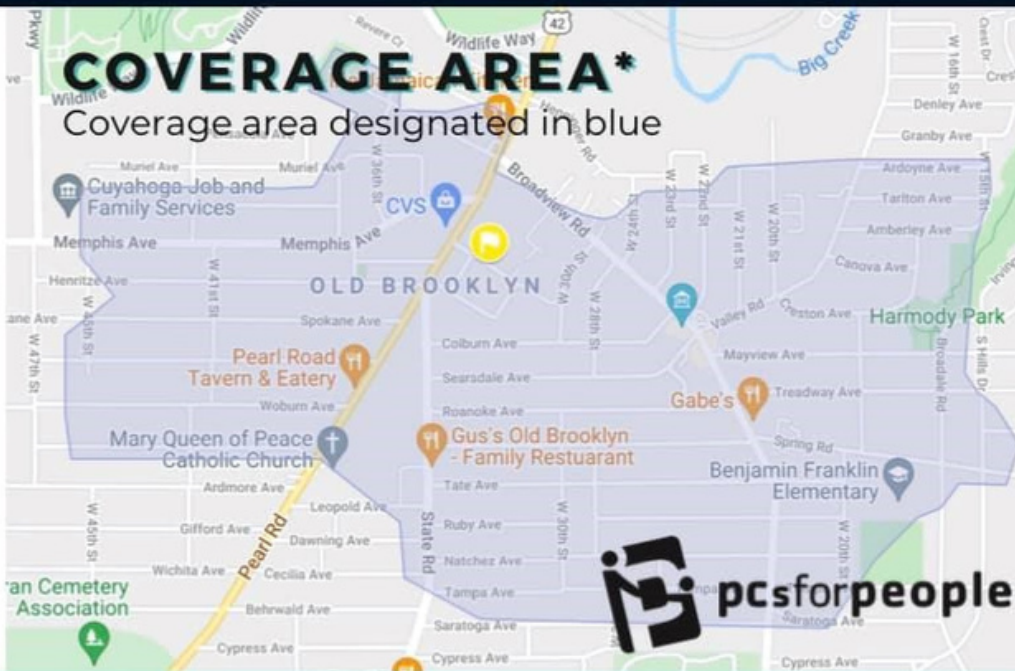
