

10 Ways to Keep Learning Going This Summer, and more

1. Learn About Programs at Your School

Learn about the programs offered at your school, or nearby schools, so that you can keep your students' families up to date.

2. Take Advantage of Reopening: Museums, Parks, etc.

3. Read, Read!

4. Set Aside Time for Learning

Encourage families to support their students' continued learning through summer by getting a workbook or activity book at their level and setting aside a certain amount of time each day for them to work on it.

5. Encourage Creative Writing

We ask students to write every day in school, and yet it is the least favorite activity of many school-aged children. Encourage children to write creatively over the summer.

6. Set Up Pen Pals

Go a step beyond encouraging creative writing and set up pen pals for students, it can be a safe way for students to continue interacting with each other over the summer and also work on writing skills. They will be excited each time they receive a letter and can practice their reading skills as well! They may even return to school in the fall with a new best friend.

7. Engage in Authentic Learning Opportunities

The more students can expand their horizons, the more excited about learning they become. It is also a great opportunity for students to learn real-world skills that will benefit them long after graduation.

8. Create Games

Encourage students to create their own games this summer. Many valuable lessons are associated with playing games—following rules, critical thinking, strategy, cooperation, teamwork, and humility in winning and losing.

9. Don't Forget About Art

The benefits of art are undeniable— encouraging imagination, honing problem-solving skills, and stress reduction.

10. Fuel Passion


