Dress Code Memo

Dress code expresses our commitment to learning, safety, high standards, and responsible dress for school and school functions. Attention to appearance is a reflection of care and concern for our students and our community. We have established these standards to create an atmosphere of self-respect and respect for others. It is the responsibility of our school system to prepare students for the world of work which requires appropriate dress. The message below details dress code expectations for the scholars of Cleveland School of Architecture and Design.

Cleveland School of Architecture and Design's Dress Code Guidelines

Tops

- Solid green or black, collared, polo-style, shirt, with short or long sleeves
- Not permitted: Patterned or printed shirts, hoodies, cropped shirts.

Bottoms

- Solid black, khaki, or dark blue pants (no jeans)
- Not permitted: Sweats, leggings, yoga pants, short skirts, or jean shorts.

Footwear

- Tennis shoes
- Boots (flat or low heel)
- Sandals with closed toes (Crocs or Croc-Style shoes are welcome)
- Not permitted: Heels over 1", flip-flops, open-toe sandals, house shoes, or slippers.

Every Friday will be Spirit Day for Cleveland School of Architecture and design students. On this day, students are permitted to wear a spirit shirt and jeans with no holes or tears.
