Consider:

- Greetings—model appropriate social skills; make eye contact, greet, shake hands; morning meeting
- Zones Check-In: Zones of Regulation; check in with students to begin/end each day
- Buddy Bench: if a student is feeling lonely, needs a break
- Visual learners: Brain Works, schedules/centers labeled with pictures/words
- First/Then
- Social stories, cartooning, power cards with favorite character, social skills groups: (Resource: Autism Internet Modules (AIM) website)
- Comfy Cafeteria, Refreshing Recess: Every Moment Counts
- Self expression:
