

OVERVIEW

In support of strengthening student academic achievement, <u>Cleveland Early College High School</u> receives Title I, Part A funds and therefore must jointly develop with, agree on with, and distribute to parents and family members of participating children a parent and family engagement policy (written or posted on school website), agreed on by such parents and family members, that shall describe the means of carrying out the requirements of The Every Students Succeeds Act (ESSA) Section 1116. Parents and family members shall be notified of the policy in an understandable and uniform format and, to the extent practicable, provided in a language the parents and family members can understand. Such a policy shall be made available to the local community and updated periodically to meet the changing needs of the parents, family members, and the school. A. ANNUAL TITLE I MEETING

<u>Cleveland Early College High School</u> will take the following actions to conduct an annual meeting, at a convenient time, and encourage and invite all parents and family members of participating children to attend to inform them about the school's Title I program, the nature of the Title I program, the parents' and family members requirements, the school parent and family engagement policy, the schoolwide plan, and the schoolparent and family compact.

This annual meeting occurs during the annual Open House program as set by the school district calendar.

B. FLEXIBLE NUMBER OF MEETINGS

<u>Cleveland Early College High School</u> will offer a flexible number of engagement meetings in accordance with the OPHAS level as outlined in Part A at convenient times for parents and families, such as meetings in the morning or evening (for which the school may use Title I funds to provide transportation, childcare or home visits, as such services relate to parent and family engagement (if the state's current OPHAS Level is 1).

Our school will hold at minimum a quarterly meeting with the Family Engagement Committee. This meeting will include a Parent Ambassador or parent representative. Each month or as needed, we will host universal, targeted, or intensive parent meeting related to academics, attendance, culture/climate, family capacity building, college & career readiness, or other items of interest that supports the school's Academic Achievement Plan. These gatherings may be in-person or virtual.



During the Back-to-School Meet & Greet event, families will be able to make the initial contact of the academic school year with the administration, faculty, and staff. Families will need to check the school website and/or social media for up-to-date information on date, time, and location.

The school with have at least one meeting a quarter totaling up to 4 meetings in a school year with the option to have more if needed or required.

C. JOINTLY DEVELOPED

Information related to the school and parent and family engagement programs, meetings, and other activities, will be provided to the parents and families of enrolled children in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents and families can understand.
