

In support of strengthening student academic achievement, Anton Grdina receives Title I, Part A funds and therefore must jointly develop with, agree on with, and distribute to parents and family members of participating children a parent and family engagement policy (written or posted on school website), agreed on by such parents and family members, that shall describe the means of carrying out the requirements of The Every Students Succeeds Act (ESSA) Section 1116. #### A. ANNUAL TITLE I MEETING

Anton Grdina will take the following actions to conduct an annual meeting, at a convenient time, and encourage and invite all parents and family members of participating children to attend to inform them about the school's Title I program, the nature of the Title I program, the parents' and family members requirements, the school parent and family engagement policy, the schoolwide plan, and the school-parent and family compact.

Considering ongoing concerns due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19), during the 2021\2022 school year, each school in the Cleveland Metropolitan School District will make the health and well-being of participants, staff, partners, and other guests a top priority. During the 2021/2022 school year, all meetings will be held in alignment with the Ohio Public Health Advisory System (OPHAS) as follows:

- Level 1 Meetings can be held in person or remotely. Any meetings held in person will be
  done with strict adherence to health and safety guidelines (handwashing, hand sanitizing,
  wearing masks and following social distance guidelines of at least 3ft), to ensure to the
  extent possible prevention of the spread of the virus.
- Level 2, 3, and 4 All meetings will be held remotely and recorded to post on the schools'
  website for viewing at a convenient time for all families, and staff.

This annual meeting occurs during the annual Open House program as set by the school district calendar.

- High School (Early Start) August 7, 2023
- High School (Traditional) September 13, 2023
- Pre-K to 8<sup>th</sup> Grade School September 14, 2023

### **B. FLEXIBLE NUMBER OF MEETINGS**

Anton Grdina will offer a flexible number of engagement meetings in accordance with the OPHAS level as outlined in Part A at convenient times for parents and families, such as meetings in the morning or evening (for which the school may use Title I funds to provide transportation, childcare or home visits, as such services relate to parent and family engagement (if the state's current OPHAS Level is 1).

Anton Grdina will host monthly PAC meetings. Meetings will be offered virtually and in person to maximize parent participation. Parent participation feedback surveys will be considered to solidify a preferred meeting time.

### C. JOINTLY DEVELOPED

- Quarterly Parent Teacher Conferences to provide updates on scholars' academic progress
- Resource fairs to connect to families based on needs discussed during monthly parent meetings
