

School Parent and Family Engagement Policy School Year 2022-2023

A. ANNUAL TITLE I MEETING

Whitney M Young PreK-8 School will take the following actions to conduct an annual meeting, at a convenient time, and encourage and invite all parents and family members of participating children to attend to inform them about the school's Title I program, the nature of the Title I program, the parents' and family members requirements, the school parent and family engagement policy, the schoolwide plan, and the school-parent and family compact.

Considering ongoing concerns due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19), during the 2022/2023 school year, each school in the Cleveland Metropolitan School District will make the health and well-being of participants, staff, partners, and other guests a top priority. During the

2022/2023 school year, all meetings will be held in alignment with the Ohio Public Health Advisory System (OPHAS) as follows:

- Level 1 Meetings can be held in person or nt. Any meetings held in person will be done with strict adherence to health and safety guidelines (handwashing, hand sanitizing, wearing masks and following social distance guidelines of at least 6ft), to ensure to the extent possible prevention of the spread of the virus.
- Level 2, 3, and 4 All meetings will be held remotely and recorded to post on the schools website for viewing at a convenient time for all families, and staff.

• Whitney M Young PreK-8 School will host the Title 1 Part A meeting in September 2021 during Open House.

B. FLEXIBLE NUMBER OF MEETINGS

Whitney M Young PreK-8 School will offer a flexible number of engagement meetings in accordance with the OPHAS level as outlined in Part A at convenient times for parents and families, such as meetings in the morning or evening (for which the school may use Title I funds to provide transportation, child care or home visits, as such services relate to parent and family engagement (if the state's current OPHAS Level is 1).

Whitney M. Young PreK-8 School will host various parent meetings and family nights.

- Whitney M. Young's Warrior Roundtables will be held at least once a quarter and will be offered at times that are accommodating to our families.
- Whitney M. Young will host the required 2 events per quarter as laid out by the FACE office. The events will either be broken down as 2 academic activities or 1 academic and 1 social activity per quarter.
- The Family Nights/Parent Meetings will include topics aligned to the school's Academic Achievement Plan such as Personalized Learning Informational meetings, Family Math Nights, Family Literacy Nights, K-3 Parent Meetings with a focus on the 3rd Grade Reading Guarantee.
- Whitney M. Young will also support families with grade level transitions such as 8th grade transition meetings, and a 5th grade transition meeting.

C. JOINTLY DEVELOPED

Whitney M Young PreK-8 School will take the following actions to engage parents and families in an organized, ongoing, and timely way, in the planning, review, and improvement of programs under Title I, Part A, including the planning, review, and improvement of the school parent and family engagement policy and the joint development of the schoolwide program plan.

- Quarterly Warrior Roundtables to discuss Family Engagement programs with parents and other Caregivers. The school will then plan activities with families that align with their needs and what is outlined in the School's Academic Achievement Plan. The school will utilize the Chat & Chew as a time for revising the Title I required documentation such as the Family Engagement Policy and School Family Compact.
- The FACE committee, which includes at least one member of the administration team, the Say Yes to Education Coordinator, school PCIA, and the Parent Liaison will meet weekly to discuss events/communication/collaboration strategies.
