School Goals:

BHSEC will provide high-quality curriculum and instruction to our students, helping them to receive both a HS diploma and A.A. in the Liberal Arts concurrently. Classroom instruction will provide a respectful and inclusive environment for all students, facilitate expression of inquiry, and support a growth mindset.

Per our AAP Bard pledges to do the following to facilitate academic achievement: Provide bridge courses to students who need support mastering content, use data to assess student competency and needs, use evidence-based resources (such as Springboard), practice writing skills in non-literature classes, support student organizational skills, and provide individualized support to all students. Departments will each host an annual event, so students can showcase work for classmates and family.

Communication methods: Weekly Newsletter, quarterly report cards, All Call (when appropriate), and calls/letters home (when appropriate). Bard will host orientations, Open House, and Parent Teacher Conferences, in accordance with CMSD guidelines. Bard will host Parent Advisory Committees, where families can join to ask questions, gain support, and help plan events. Bard will host Schoology "get connected" events and will send out correspondence encouraging families to sign up for Schoology accounts. By doing so, families will have easier access to information relevant to Bard and their child's education including current grades, assignments, and attendance. Faculty will also reach out to families of struggling students, as well as individually invite families to upcoming events at the school.

Academic supports available: Office hours (hosted by instructors outside of classroom time), Writing Center, Math Tutoring Center, Bilingual Aide, IEP and 504 (when appropriate)

The Classroom

[Instructors and administrators will inform parents and families of educational practices and scholar process by:

- Helping families use Schoology to monitor student progress in real-time
- Instructor calls (or messages) to families, alerting them to student progress.
- Letters from administration, when appropriate
- Report cards from school, quarterly
- Instructors and administrators will establish and maintain consistent twoway communication
- Availability for feedback and support via phone, Schoology message, and in-person meetings

The Scholar

[Scholars will support their academic achievement by:]

- Focusing on academic priorities while at school. Students will be responsible for behaving "professionally" at school, including respectful treatment of
 classmates/instructors, safe behaviors in the building, and developing strong co-curricular skills such as time management, appropriate
 communication, organizational skills, use of a planner, etc.
- Attending all classes every day unless there is an excused absence. Arrive to class on time and prepared to learn. Refrain from cell phone use in the
 classroom (except when permitted by instructor).
- Participating in weekly advisory.
- Setting aside time each day to complete homework, review materials, study, read for class, etc.
- Communicating with faculty and administrators about academic and social/emotional needs. Students should communicate about issues as early as they can, so the school may provide adequate support.
- Taking care of and being responsible for any technology provided by the school.
- Keep updated on important information from school by reviewing Newsletter weekly and checking Schoology messages regularly. Student should relay
 important information to family members, such as when important events are happening at school.
