At Home

- Monitoring attendance by getting to school on time (7:35) and notifying the main office when scholars are absent.
- Consistently reviewing school website, Facebook Page, and Classroom Dojo
- Creating a school/workspace at home
- Making sure that homework is completed.
- Monitoring electronic device usage and exposure to social media
- Ensuring that scholars get regular rest, and healthy nutritional meals.
- Promoting positive use of scholar's extracurricular time
- Staying informed about my scholar's education and communication with the school by promptly reading all notices from the school or the school district
- Participate in all parent teacher conferences held three times a year in October 2024, February 2025, and April 2025.
- Encouraging students to stay focused in class and be respectful to staff and each other.
