School Goals

Wade Park will use evidence based curriculums in Reading and Math. We will implement Into Reading (K – 5), Into Literacy (6 – 8) and Into Math (K – 8). Science Fusion and Social Studies Weekly are also being used.

Parent conferences will be held on District established dates. Wade Park will supplement conference dates with SPO.

Wade Park will distribute interim progress reports and report cards every nine weeks to inform parents of progress.

The Classroom

Parents are encouraged to participate in the SPO. They are also encouraged to volunteer at the school, attend assemblies and school daytime and evening activities.

Teachers will provide information to be added to the monthly newsletter. Teachers will also call parents and send home progress information when applicable.

At Home

Scholars:
