PACE is... Planning and Career Exploration

- embedded curriculum for 6th 12th graders that provides them with knowledge, skills, experiences, and confidence to uncover the occupations or careers they want to pursue.
- a variety of quality in-school and out-of-school lessons and experiences that facilitate exploration.
- all students graduating with a career pathway plan which was intentionally designed through planning and active decision-making.
- a new way of thinking that shifts the conversation from "Are you going to college" to "What is your career goal or vision? Here are multiple ways to get there."
- advising and supports that enable students to take their vision From HERE to CAREER.

PACE was developed over a two-year period with support from more than 100 individuals, 40 organizations and 75 employers.

We launched in November 2021.
