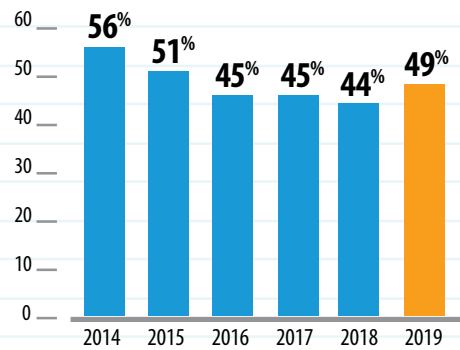

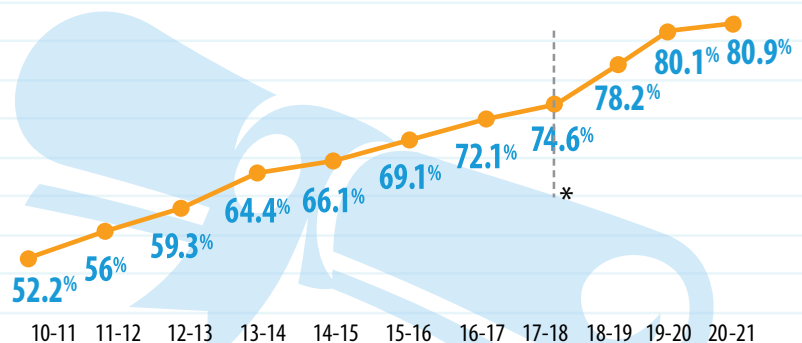

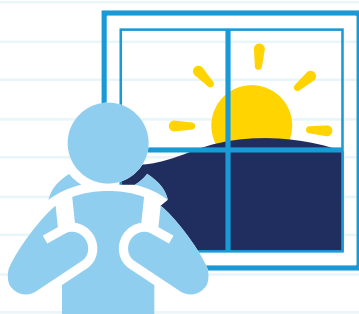

HOW TO USE THE SCHOOL CHOICE PORTAL

How to log in to the portal

- Go to ChooseCMSD.org and select [Enter the School Choice Portal](#). Access this site from any computer with an Internet connection or from your mobile device.
- You can switch the language to [Español](#) by clicking on the blue language box in the upper right corner.
- If you already have a username and password, enter the information and click [READY, SET, GO!](#) If you are new to CMSD, click [SIGN UP](#). You will be prompted to enter information about you and your child.

How to review your family information

- Once you sign in, you'll see a list of all the children in your family and their current schools. If you need to add a student that is currently not in the system, click [ADD ANOTHER STUDENT](#). Once added, continue with the directions below.
- To begin the process, click [MAKE SCHOOL CHOICE](#) next to your child's name.

How to make an informed school choice

- After selecting the student for whom you want to make 2022-23 school choices, you will verify that child's current information before selecting your school choices.
- Review school information that best fits the needs and interests of your child; then select [up to five \(5\)](#) schools that meet your child's needs. After making your selections, click [NEXT](#) at the bottom of the page.

How to prioritize your school choices

- Once you have made your school choices, you can prioritize with the [Top Choice](#) in slot #1.
- This does not necessarily mean you will get a spot at that school. A lottery will be run for schools that have a greater number of applications than seats available.

How to confirm and submit your school choices

- The last step is to review and confirm your data. Once you submit information, you will see the confirmation screen.
- You will then return to the [Student Dashboard](#) where you can make choices for your other children by following the same process as specified above.
- If you are at a public computer, remember to log out when you are done.

Support Services

MY CHILD HAS SPECIAL NEEDS. WHERE CAN WE ACCESS THE SUPPORTS AVAILABLE?

All CMSD schools provide access to specially designed instruction, related services, and accommodations for students with Individualized Education Plans (IEPs). We therefore encourage students with special needs and their families to consider every available school option, including our criteria schools.

A number of CMSD high schools have added specialized programs and services to meet the most intensive needs of our students.

If, when exploring your high school choices, your preferred school does not offer your child's specialized program or services, a CMSD Enrollment Specialist will follow up with you to discuss your school options.

Placement of students in programs designed around their special needs is tentative until the student's Individual Education Plan (IEP) reviews are complete.

ALL-CITY ARTS ACROSS THE DISTRICT

All-City Arts provides free afterschool music and dance training to high school students Districtwide. Programming is available free of charge at Glenville, Garrett Morgan and the John Marshall Campus. Transportation is provided. In addition to learning from industry professionals, all participants have multiple opportunities to perform at a variety of venues throughout the county.

FREE TRANSPORTATION ACROSS THE DISTRICT

To help students reach high schools across the District, the Board of Education provides free transportation through the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority (RTA).

Students who live at least two miles from school can ride RTA with an identification card issued by the District. The cards may be used from 5:30 am to 8 pm on school days only.

MULTILINGUAL MULTICULTURAL EDUCATION & WORLD LANGUAGES

Multilingual Multicultural Education is aligned with state and District standards. Second language learners are held to the same high expectations established for all students. A focus in academic language development will advance literacy and proficiency in the native language and the second language in listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Students who speak a language other than English, or live in a household where another language is spoken, must register at the Multilingual Multicultural Welcome Center located at 3145 West 46th St, Cleveland, 44102. CMSD's Multilingual Multicultural Department oversees the implementation of world languages Districtwide. INTERSCHOLASTIC ATHLETICS & ACTIVITIES—STUDENT ELIGIBILITY

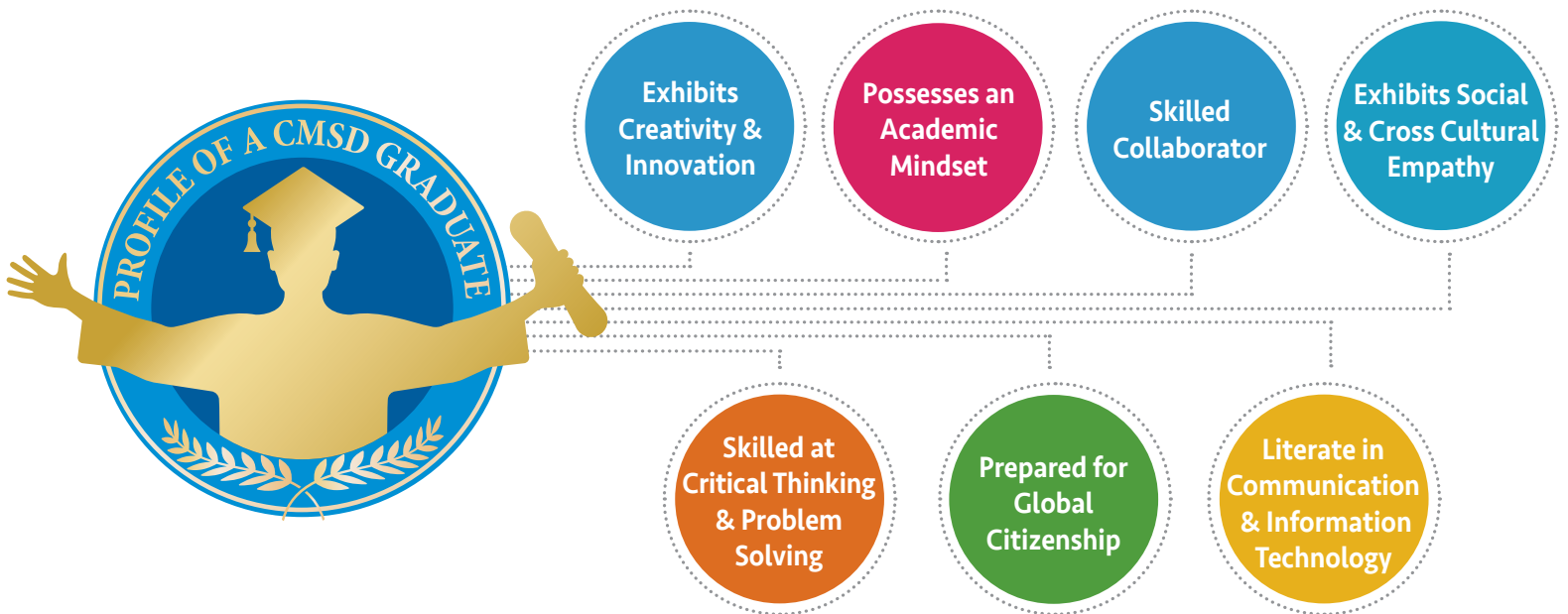

Bard High School Early College (BHSEC) Cleveland is a four-year public school that provides students with the unique opportunity to take a two-year, tuition-free college course of study in the liberal arts and sciences following the 9th and 10th grades. Through the partnership between Bard College and the Cleveland Metropolitan School District, we make it possible for students to earn both a high school diploma and up to 60 transferable college credits and an Associate in Arts degree from Bard College within four years.

BHSEC provides a rigorous course of study that emphasizes critical thinking through writing, discussion, and inquiry. The school seeks to intellectually engage a diverse group of motivated high school students and prepare them for success in college and beyond. The curriculum is composed of a two-year college preparatory sequence in the 9th and 10th grades that segues directly into a two-year college course of study in place of the traditional 11th and 12th grades. BHSEC faculty members are experienced college professors who teach grades 9-12, all in one building.

The BHSEC campus is a center of intellectual energy and community. From our Writing and Thinking Workshops, which begin the academic year, to our Seminar Sequence, to college electives in humanities, mathematics, sciences, and the arts, all of our students enjoy the benefits of a well-rounded, liberal arts education within a close-knit environment of supportive faculty and students who truly enjoy learning from one another. This alternative to traditional high school is founded on the belief that many young people are ready and eager to do serious college work starting at age 16. According to one study from Dr. Liz Bergeron at the University of Wisconsin La Crosse, students completing the IB Diploma Programme were more likely to enroll immediately in college and, among those enrolling, more likely to choose a four-year college and to graduate from college in four years.

MC²STEM uses a mastery assessment system for grading, and students must achieve an 80% on benchmark assessments before receiving an "M" for Mastery, and credit is given for the course. Following the "master your own path" motto, students are supported with tutors, mentors, differentiated instruction, and additional study time with teachers through coaching sessions. Students who are academically ready in grades 9-12 can take college-level classes through our Cuyahoga Community College and Cleveland State University partners.

New Tech West High School (A Say Yes School) is a diverse, community based school that offers small class sizes that uses a dynamic classroom approach called Project Based Learning (PBL). PBL allows students to actively explore real-world problems, challenges, and gain deeper learning through their educational experiences. With a one-to-one student-to-computer ratio, students create presentations, build their own websites, conduct academic research, and work together in collaborative student groups to demonstrate mastery of state standards. NTW scholars have an opportunity to participate in College Credit Plus, Robotics Courses, Graphic Design, and Computer Science classes as well as interactive labs. Through these learning opportunities, students develop excellent written and verbal communication skills and build a growth mindset as they take ownership for their learning.

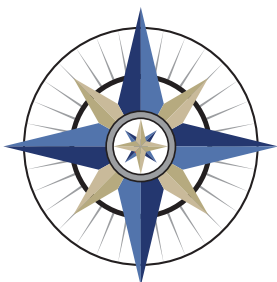

Students participate in sports and other extracurricular activities at the historic James Ford Rhodes campus in the heart of Old Brooklyn. Our school promotes four core principles: advocacy, stewardship, curiosity, and innovation.

Students advance at their own pace as they master content. Graduates will be prepared to attend college and pursue careers in a variety of fields including finance and life science/engineering industries.

What sets our school apart?

- We provide many learning opportunities outside the school including research at the Zoo and an end of year capstone experience for each grade level.

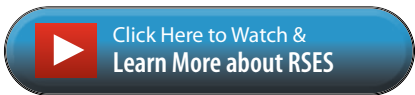

The School of One is dedicated to producing successful graduates by offering a differentiated, individualized, online educational experience embedded with academic, social and emotional services necessary to ensure college and career readiness. Students are assigned to a nontraditional educational team committed to their progress in fulfilling graduation requirements.

The School of One operates as one collective CMSD high school; however, our population is distributed among nine sites located around Cleveland. Students will attend one site, each having a flexible schedule with no more than 20 students per session. Seven of our sites are located at the following high schools: Collinwood, East Tech, Glenville, Rhodes Campus, John Adams, John Marshall (located at Bard Early College), and Lincoln-West. We also have two specialized sites located at The Foundry – which provides students the opportunity to learn to row and sail and includes employment opportunities – and the LGBT Community Center at Gordon Square.

Our staff works collaboratively with students to identify academic needs, areas of interest and barriers that may limit success. Teachers and students collaborate to develop an educational plan to create a new path to academic and personal success and flexible scheduling allows students to take college courses through Tri-C. Formal graduation takes place three times a year, allowing students to immediately begin their path to college and career.



Nontraditional Education Choices

Cleveland Metro Remote School

At the Cleveland Metropolitan Remote School (CMRS) students will be a part of the foundation of new learning. Students will help create the vision, mission, and landscape for remote learning within the District and help to influence the structure of future remote learners within our community. CMRS learning is unique with a diverse population of students that span the entire state of Ohio, which allows for different student perspectives shared through class and online post discussions to foster and develop new ideas.

Expectations for Scholars:

- attend Remote Orientation to practice navigating online platform and systems.
- attend class between 8:00am - 2:30pm on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday.
- complete work independently and attend class meetings between 8:00am - 2:30pm on Wednesday.
- engage in class discussion through verbal communication, Zoom chat, or discussion boards.
- complete all classwork assigned by educators within Schoology.
- be best equipped when they learn in an independent setting, while attending live, virtual sessions, and self-pace their learning to fit their needs.
- meet certain benchmarks and be promoted and/or accomplish graduation.
- complete all District and state-mandated testing at a CMSD facility

Benefits for Scholars:

- participate in District athletics/clubs at their home school based on current address.
- be connected with Say Yes services and scholarships.
- be connected with advanced programming such as College Credit Plus.
- have the option to partner with the community for academic and mental health supports.
- participate in social events promoted by CMRS and/or partner CMSD schools.

The Nontraditional Education Office (NEO) is designed to coordinate, support and implement strategies that give students and families alternative pathways to achieve college and career readiness. The office includes Home Schooling, Virtual Academy, Residential Schools and The Downtown Education Center. These programs provide students an opportunity to move through an approved curriculum that will prepare them for graduation and beyond. Wraparound supports, special education services and academic counseling are provided. We provide alternative learning pathways to obtain a diploma to a diverse population of students.

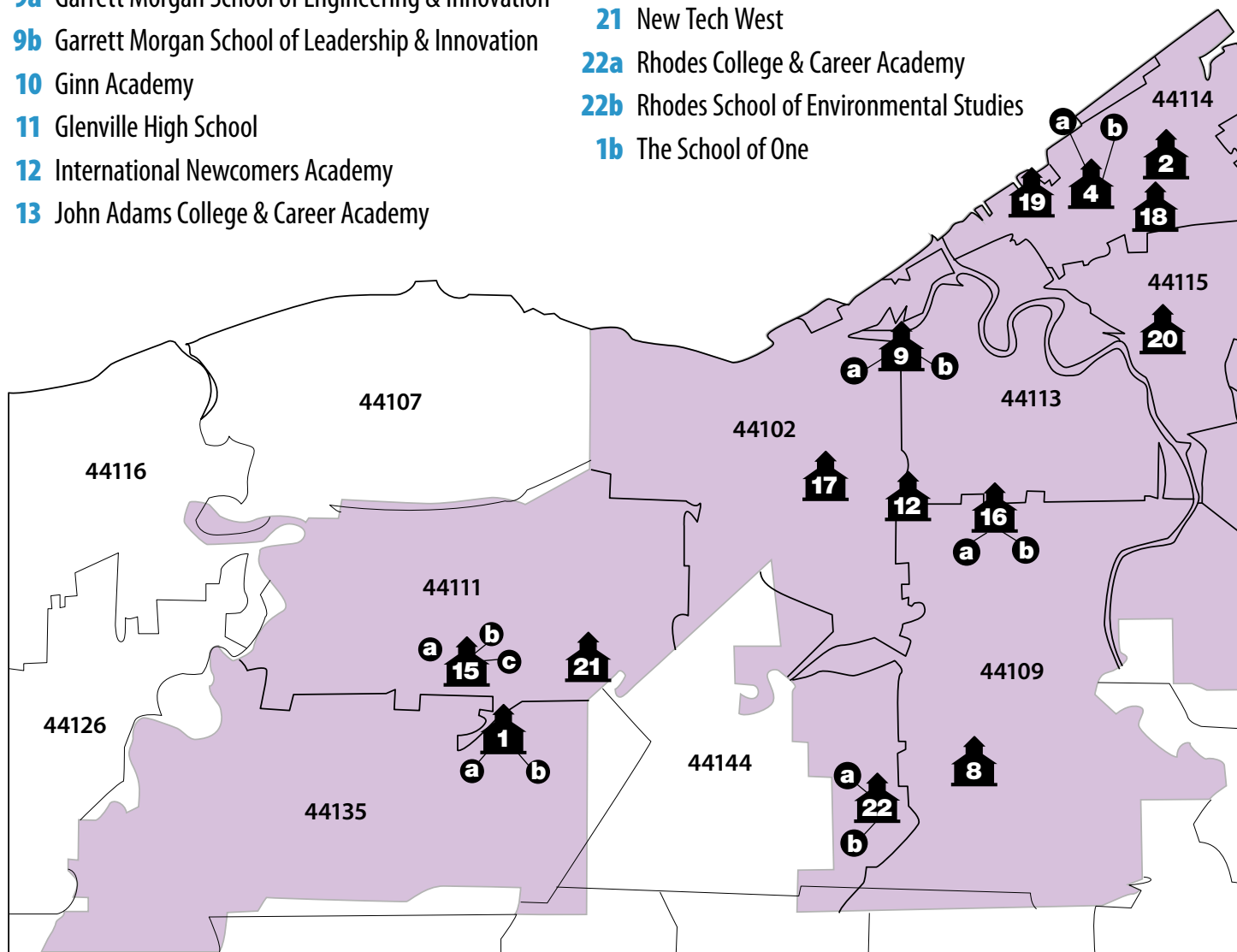
Home Schooling is a right of parents under state law. Notification of a parent's intent to home school their child can be completed online at the District website. Families must provide resources and a curriculum that prepares students to meet the same academic criteria as students who attend traditional school. Parents must provide 900 hours of instruction and notify the CEO each year their child is home schooled. If a parent decides to return their child to public school, they must identify the most recent grade reached and the school will decide placement. Parents are required to provide an assessment document at the completion of each year. All information is directed to the CEO for processing.

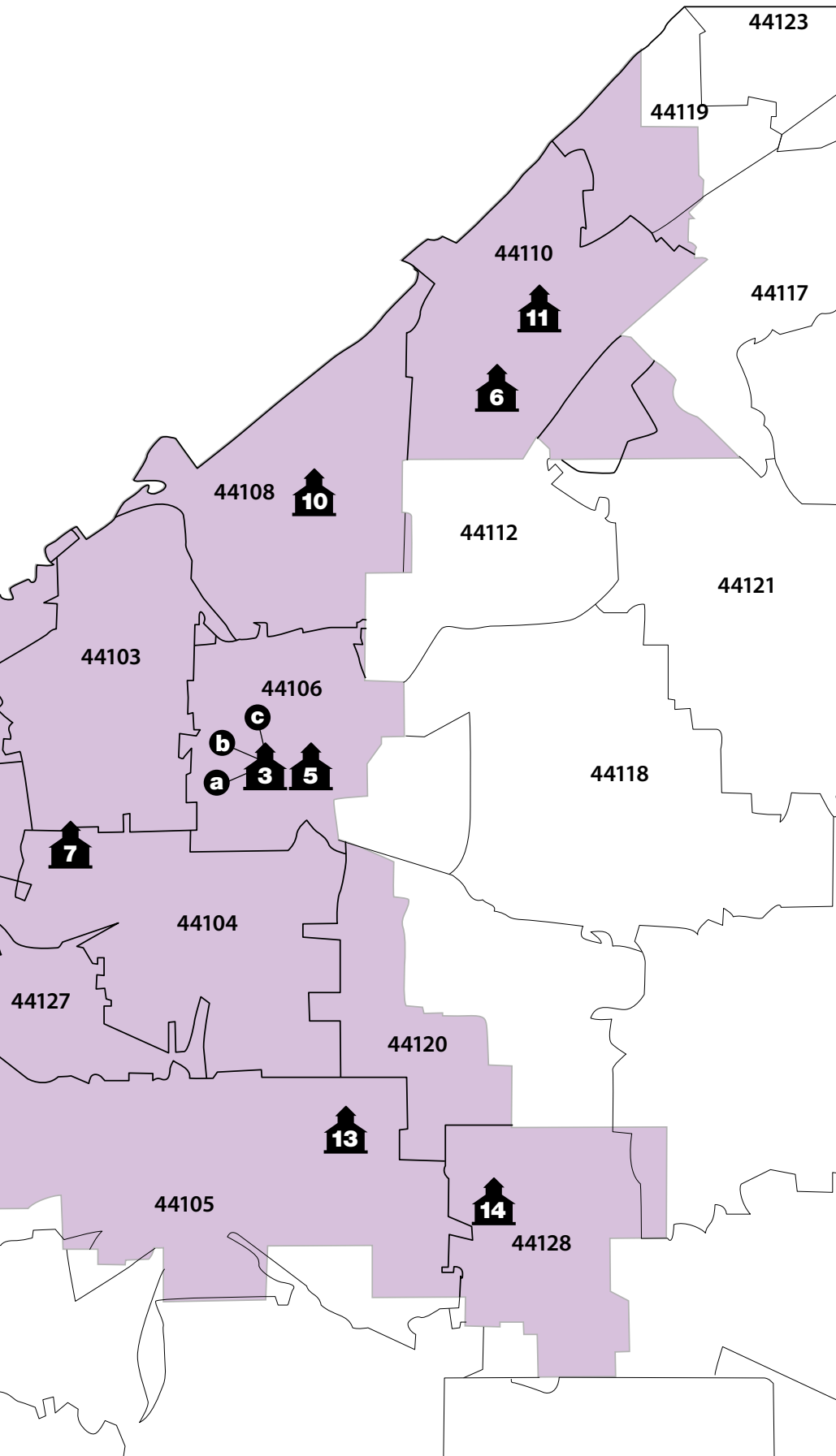
Virtual Academy is an online curriculum provided by Edgenuity and accommodates students in grades K-12. Courses are aligned with District Scope and Sequence and state Common Core Standards. Virtual 'live' teacher support is available by CMSD certified instructors, and laptops are provided to all enrolled students. Students participating in the Virtual Academy may also participate in CMSD athletics, afterschool programs and other events at their registered home school. This independent, self-guided instructional pathway allows for diverse young adult lifestyles. Programming is available to students 7 days a week, 24 hours a day. A resource coordinator works with families to minimize barriers to student success. Students are assigned to take District-mandated assessment tests at the East Professional Center. Graduation ceremonies are held at the student's registered home school. Students are invited and encourage to participate in all senior events for which they are qualified.
