Choosing CMSD for your child's high school experience also brings a big bonus with it. Every student who is continuously enrolled in a CMSD high school and lives in the City of Cleveland or District from ninth grade through graduation will receive a Say Yes Cleveland tuition scholarship.

The Say Yes scholarship can be used toward career training or for college. The scholarship covers up to the full value of tuition, minus federal and state aid, to all

public colleges, universities and Pell-eligible training programs in Ohio and more than 100 private colleges and universities across the country.



Say Yes also has placed a family support specialist in every building to organize services, tailored to individual school needs, that help families overcome barriers to success. Services include mental health counseling, legal assistance and more.

School Overview

Bard High School Early College Cleveland is a partnership between Bard College and the Cleveland Metropolitan School District. Students can earn an Associate of Arts degree from Bard College concurrently with a high school diploma.

BHSEC provides a rigorous course of study that emphasizes critical thinking through writing, discussion and inquiry. The school seeks to intellectually engage a diverse group of motivated high school students and prepare them for success in college and beyond.

- Students earn up to 60 transferable college credits, tuition-free.
- BHSEC offers a rigorous academic program that is taught by college professors, most of whom have advanced degrees in their fields.
- The curriculum in the 9th and 10th grade is an accelerated platform that allows students to complete high school and transition to college level courses in 11th and 12th grade.
- In addition to the Liberal Arts degree program, BHSEC offers an array of arts courses such as two- and three-dimensional art, dance and orchestra.
- BHSEC Cleveland has a partnership with Esperanza

BHSEC Cleveland benefits from Bard College's 20 years of experience running successful early colleges in partnership with public school districts. Bard is a selective criteria school with an admissions process.

School Overview

Campus International High School is CMSD's only International Baccalaureate high school. All students take a full college-level course load in the humanities, science and the arts as they work toward earning an IB diploma.

Our school is located on the Cleveland State University campus and has a formal partnership with the university.

Our students:

- learn by doing, as they become engaged in projects and service learning.
- take four years of a world language.
- engage annually in a significant independent research project on a topic of community need or personal interest.

The level of classes that students take as juniors and seniors is equivalent to college-level coursework. At the conclusion of all IB courses, students sit for an exam that, in addition to helping them earn the IB diploma, can gain them college credit with qualifying scores.

HOME SCHOOLING

Home schooling is a right of parents under state law. Notification of a parent's intent to home-school their child can be completed online at the District website.

- Families must provide resources and a curriculum that prepares students to meet the same academic criteria as students who attend traditional schools.
- Parents must provide 900 hours of instruction and notify the CEO each year
 that their child is home-schooled. If a parent decides to return their child
 to public school, they must identify the most recent grade reached, and the
 school will decide on placement.
- Parents are required to provide an assessment document at the completion of each year.
- All information is directed to the CEO for processing.

VIRTUAL ACADEMY

Virtual Academy is an online curriculum provided by Edgenuity and accommodates students in grades K-12. Courses are aligned with District Scope and Sequence and state Common Core Standards. Virtual 'live' teacher support is available by CMSD-certified instructors, and laptops are provided to all enrolled students.

Students participating in the Virtual Academy may also participate in CMSD athletics, afterschool programs and other events at their registered home school.

- This independent, self-guided instructional pathway allows for diverse young adult lifestyles.
- Programming is available to students 7 days a week, 24 hours a day.
- A resource coordinator works with families to minimize barriers to student success.
- Students are assigned to take District-mandated assessment tests at the East Professional Center.
- Graduation ceremonies are held at the student's registered home school.
- Students are invited and encourage to participate in all senior events for which they are qualified.

SCHOOL SAFETY

At a time when school safety is in the national spotlight, CMSD continues to outpace other districts in the proactive measures we take to keep students safe every day.

All CMSD schools provide access to specially designed instruction, related services and accommodations for students with Individualized Education Plans (IEPs). We encourage students with special needs and their families to consider every available school option, including our criteria schools.

Students who live at least two miles from school can ride RTA with an identification card issued by the District. The cards may be used from 5:30 am to 8 pm on school days only.



MULTILINGUAL MULTICULTURAL EDUCATION

Multilingual Multicultural Education is aligned with state and District standards. Second language learners are held to the same high expectations established for all students.

A focus on academic language development will advance literacy and proficiency in the native language and the second language in listening, speaking, reading and writing. 


