School's Data		District Information
Student Enrollment (SY 24-25)	205	High School enrollment ranges from 137 to 606, with the middle point across all schools (median) at 333.  A school with at least 500 students — about 125 students in each grade 9th through 12th — can offer more opportunities for students.
Enrollment Trend (2022 to 2025)	-23%	The enrollment trend across all of our high schools ranged from a 36% loss to a 20% gain. The median change across schools was a drop of 7%.  Independent enrollment studies predict that the total number of students will keep going down over the next several years, mainly because fewer children are being born.
Building Condition Score	In Design (per OFCC Segment 8 plans)	High school building condition scores range from 44 to 90. The middle point score across all schools (median) is 83.  Our long-term goal is to keep every school building at a score of 80 or higher.
Building Planning Capacity	In Design (per OFCC Segment 8 plans)	All but one of our high school buildings can hold well over 500 students.  This high school is on a co-located campus, sharing a building with other high school(s).  When student enrollment is significantly lower than a building's capacity, the district must spend resources to maintain unused space, which means fewer resources for students and staff.

## **DEFINITIONS OF KEY TERMS**

Student enrollment is the end-of-year enrollment in grades 9 through 12, as reported by the Ohio Department of Education for all schools in the state.

Enrollment trend shows how the number of students at a school has changed by comparing the most recent end-of-year enrollment to previous years.

**Building condition score** shows how much maintenance a building needs in its main systems, like A/C, plumbing, roofs, and windows. Lower scores mean more repairs are needed. This score is a snapshot in time as of Spring 2025.

Building planning capacity is the potential number of students a building could hold for future state planning purposes.

Ohio State Report Card Star Rating can range from 1 to 5 stars, with more stars meaning stronger performance on state measures like student achievement, progress, and graduation. Star ratings for SY 24-25 will be issued by the Ohio Department of Education this fall.
