## **DEFINITIONS OF KEY TERMS**

**K-12 Enrollment** is the end-of-year enrollment in grades Kindergarten through 12th grade, as reported by the Ohio Department of Education for all schools in the state. **K-12 Enrollment trend** shows how the number of students at a school has changed by comparing the most recent end-of-year enrollment to previous years.

**Building condition score** shows how much maintenance a building needs in its main systems, like A/C, plumbing, roofs, and windows. Lower scores mean more repairs are needed. This score is a snapshot in time as of Spring 2025.

Ohio State Report Card Star Rating can range from 1 to 5 stars, with more stars meaning stronger performance on state measures like student achievement, progress, and graduation. Star ratings for SY 24-25 will be issued by the Ohio Department of Education this fall.
