DEFINITIONS OF KEY TERMS

K-8 Enrollment is the end-of-year enrollment in grades Kindergarten through 8th grade, as reported by the Ohio Department of Education for all schools in the state.

Enrollment trend shows how the number of students at a school has changed by comparing the most recent end-of-year enrollment to previous years.

Building condition score shows how much maintenance a building needs in its main systems, like A/C, plumbing, roofs, and windows. Lower scores mean more repairs are needed. This score is a snapshot in time as of Spring 2025.

Ohio State Report Card Star Rating can range from 1 to 5 stars, with more stars meaning stronger performance on state measures like student achievement, progress, and graduation. Star ratings for SY 24-25 will be issued by the Ohio Department of Education this fall.
