Course Description:

Welcome to World History/Geography!! This course is designed to help students expand and apply social studies skills in a study of world history and geography that includes world cultures, economics, geography and government. Students will study different cultural groups to see how they have interacted in history. The course will also examine how events, ideas and government actions have impacted the world from 1600 to the present. The course will also examine the fundamental concepts of geography with the migration of people and their interaction to the environment and each other through global interaction and interdependence. This class is required to graduate. Students will earn 1 credit for History and .5 credit for geography. There will be two separate grades for World History and Geography.

Course Requirements:

- CLASS NOTES All students are required to take notes daily. It is expected that the notes be kept in the three-ring binder/notebook.
- ➤ CLASS PARTICIPATION Each student is expected to participate in class every day through class discussions, listening, group activities, etc. Being late to class, talking while someone is speaking and sleeping in class will cause you to miss out on something that is important to the class. (Have Common Sense)
- > TESTS & QUIZZES Tests and Quizzes will use a variety of methods that include: map identifications, multiple choice, graphs/charts, cartoon analysis, short answer and essays. I will never give you a pop quiz.

- ➤ **Bell Work/ Exit Ticket** Bell work will be assigned at the beginning of each class and a exit ticket will be assigned at the conclusion of class.
- **Binder Assignment** Keep all assignments; at the end of each quarter I will randomly choose 10 assignments for you to place in a binder with your copy of the syllabus (30 points)
