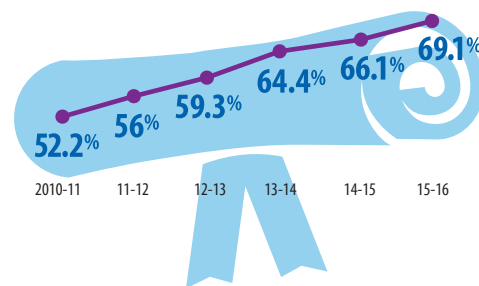

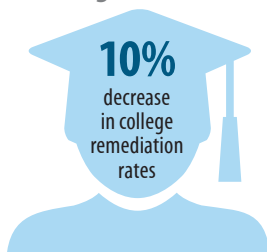
Improved Scores on "Nation's Report Card"

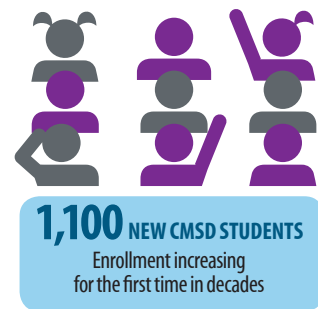

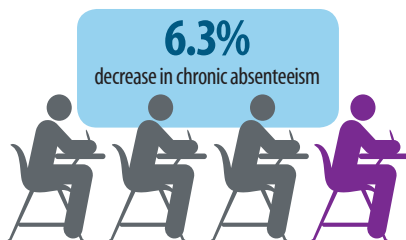

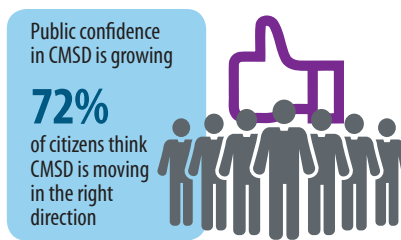

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GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS



The graduation requirements for the classes of 2018 and beyond include curriculum and three options to show readiness for next steps in college and careers. These requirements apply to students who entered ninth grade for the first time in the 2014-2015 school year.

CREDIT REQUIREMENTS

Ohio requires students to take and complete a minimum of 22 credits.

English Language Arts.....	4.0 units
Health.....	.5 units
Mathematics.....	4.0 units
Physical Education.....	.5 units
Science.....	3.0 units
Social Studies.....	3.0 units

ONE OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING OPTIONS

Ohio's State Tests

Students earn a cumulative passing score of 18 points, using seven end-of-course state tests.

Industry Credential & Workforce Readiness

Students earn 12 points through a State Board of Education-approved industry credential or credentials in a single career field and achieve a workforce readiness score on the WorkKeys assessment.

College Admission Test

Students earn "remediation-free" scores on a nationally recognized college admission exam.

ADMISSION GUIDELINES

Students who apply to a high school will be admitted until all available seats are full. After that, applicants will be placed on a waiting list for admission should seats become available. Students residing in the Cleveland Metropolitan School District will be given priority in the admission process.

NOTE: If demand is high at some schools, priority may be given to students who live in the area. Enrollment specialists are available Monday through Friday at 216.838.5437 to assist families with their school choices.

All admission information and documentation are available to students and families in both Spanish and English. Interpreters are available to facilitate the application and enrollment process for families that require language services. Call the Multilingual Multicultural Department at 216.838.0140 for assistance.

FREE TRANSPORTATION ACROSS THE DISTRICT

To help students reach high schools across the District, the Board of Education provides free transportation through the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority (RTA).

Students who live at least one mile from school can ride RTA with an identification card issued by the District. The cards may be used from 5:30 am to 8 pm on school days.

Protect your ID card — If you lose your card, the first replacement is free; a \$10 fee will be charged if lost again.

THE SCHOOL OF ONE

The School of One is a flexible high school educational program in the Cleveland Metropolitan School District, specifically designed to meet the needs of gifted, talented and undecided students whose circumstances dictate a more personalized and supportive academic environment. Sites are conveniently located inside CMSD neighborhood high schools.

You can earn industry certification in business and take rigorous courses that prepare you for college classes. You will have access to a computer and advance at your own pace as you master content.

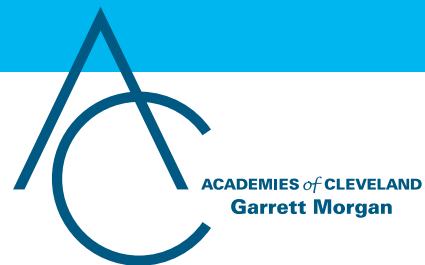
