East Region: K-8 Metric Highlights





■ This is the lowest academic performance of any region.



- While overall enrollment declined from 2013 to 2017, District schools experienced a 7% enrollment increase due to large charter enrollment declines. Combined K-8 enrollment is forecast to decline 2.4% by 2022-23.
- 60% of regional students attend District schools over other options.



- 33% of District K-8 schools are above the minimum enrollment target of 360 students, the second lowest of any region.
- Two of the nine schools in the region meet the desired enrollment size of 450 students.



- 79% of District K-8 seats are in use, leaving approximately 1,000 empty seats in District schools in the region and roughly 250 empty charter seats.
- 63% of students attending District K-8 schools are served in buildings that are newly built since 2002.



2017-18 K-8 Enrollment for East Region Schools by 2018 ODE Report Card Grades



- 9% of enrollment is at a C-rated school and there are no A or Brated schools in the region.
- 91% of K-8 enrollment is at either a D or Frated school, the highest rates of any region in the city.



2017-18 District and Charter K-8 School Locations by 2018 ODE Report Card Grades




- The East Region has the lowest access to high quality seats of any region.

Historical and Forecast Enrollment of K-8 Students Residing in the East Region Attending a School Anywhere in the City




- While overall enrollment declined from 2013 to 2017, District schools experienced a 7% enrollment increase due to large charter enrollment declines.

East Region: How are K-8 students choosing among their available school options?


2017-18 Enrollment by School Type and Location for East Residents



- 60% of K-8 students residing in the East region attend District schools over other options.
- 50% of K-8 students residing in the East region attend a charter or District school outside of the region. This is the highest rate of any region.

Heat Map of School-Aged Student Population with District and Charter K-8 School Locations




- There are four significant areas of population density in the region.
- The Central Neighborhood represents one of the most dense schoolaged student populations, but is home to three underenrolled schools.

East Region: What percentage of District K-8 schools meet minimum enrollment targets?


District K-8 Schools in East Region with 2017-18 K-8 Enrollment Above 360 Students



- District K-8 schools with at least 360 students are more likely to have the resources to sustain the baseline desired learning and teaching experience. This minimum enrollment target is the equivalent of about 20 students per class with two classes for each grade level from kindergarten to 8th grade.
- Ideally, District K-8 schools would enroll closer to 450 students, or about 25 students per class with two classes for each grade level, allowing for funding necessary for a more vibrant and viable school program.
- 33% of District K-8 schools are above the minimum enrollment target of 360 students, the second lowest of any region.

2017-18 K-8 Enrollment Trend for Schools With Fewer Than 360 Students by 2017-18 School Locations





- Only two of the nine schools in the region, Campus International and Harvey Rice, meet the desired enrollment target of 450 students, with Dike above the minimum target of 360 students.
- Charter closures in the area in recent years have allowed most District schools in the region to maintain or increase enrollment, with only one District K-8 school experiencing a negative enrollment trend.



East Region: What percentage of District K-8 seats are utilized based on their facility age?






- 79% of all District K-8 seats in the region are utilized. 89% of seats in newer buildings are utilized, while 66% of seats in buildings constructed prior to 2002 are utilized.
- 63% of students attending District K-8 schools are served in buildings that are newly built since 2002. Four of the nine District K-8 buildings in this region predate 2002.
- New/renovated buildings have capacity to serve most, but not all students forecast to attend District schools in the future.

- There are 36 special education classrooms and nine PreK classrooms in the region, which adjust capacity by 1,125 seats. With this adjustment, there are roughly 1,000 open seats in District K-8 buildings.
- Charters in the region report roughly 250 empty seats in their buildings.




East Region: Where do students reside? Benesch: 71% of students reside within a mile






East Region: Where do students reside?

Bolton: 37% of students reside within a mile






East Region: Where do students reside? Campus Intl K-8: 5% of students reside within a mile




East Region: Where do students reside?

Dike: 16% of students reside within a mile








