




West Region: K-8 Metric Highlights



 34% of enrollment in the West region is at schools rated A, B or C, while 66% of enrollment is at schools rated D or F.



- The West region gained 130 students from 2013 to 2017 and is forecast for flat enrollment through 2022-23.
- 56% of students in the West region attend a District school.



- 71% of District K-8 schools are above the minimum viability target of 360 students, the highest rate of any region.
- Three of the seven regional schools meet the desired target of 450 students.



- 64% of District K-8 seats are in use, leaving roughly 1,700 empty District seats in the region and roughly 500 empty charter seats.
- 28% of students attending District K-8 schools are served in buildings newly built since 2002, the lowest rate of any region.






2017-18 District and Charter K-8 School Locations by 2018 ODE Report Card Grades

West Region: What do enrollment forecasts suggest about changes in K-8 enrollment?


Historical and Forecast Enrollment of K-8 Students Residing in the East Region Attending a School Anywhere in the City



- West K-8 population grew by 130 students, or 2%, from 2013 to 2017. District schools experienced all of this gain, while charters slightly declined.
- The combined West K-8 enrollment is forecast to stay flat through 2022-23 with no significant shifts between charter and District share.


West Region: How are K-8 students choosing among their available school options?

2017-18 Enrollment by School Type and Location for West Residents



- 56% of K-8 students are choosing District schools. Of these, only 55% choose to stay within West region, the lowest rate of any region.
 - 39% of students residing in the West region choose to attend a school outside the region, the second highest rate of any region behind the East region.




Heat Map of School-Aged Student Population with District and Charter K-8 School Locations

The majority of the region's population density is concentrated in the Stockyards, Clark-Fulton, and Brooklyn Centre neighborhoods.

West Region: What percentage of District K-8 schools meet minimum enrollment targets?


District K-8 Schools in West Region with 2017-18 K-8 Enrollment Above 360 Students



- District K-8 schools with at least 360 students are more likely to have the resources to sustain the baseline desired learning and teaching experience. This minimum enrollment target is the equivalent of about 20 students per class with two classes for each grade level from kindergarten to 8th grade.
- Ideally, District K-8 schools would enroll closer to 450 students, or about 25 students per class with two classes for each grade level, allowing for funding necessary for a more vibrant and viable school program.
- 71% of District K-8 schools are above the minimum enrollment target of 360 students, which is the highest rate of any region. Three of the seven regional schools meet the desired enrollment target of 450 students.

2017-18 K-8 Enrollment Trend for Schools With Fewer Than 360 Students by 2017-18 School Locations




- Five of the seven schools are above the minimum viable enrollment target and have all experienced positive or flat enrollment over the last five years.
- The two schools that are below the minimum target have both experienced declining enrollment since 2013.

METHOD: Enrollment trend reflects the difference between 2013 and 2017 K-12 geo-coded student-level enrollment data provided by CMSD. Growth of 20 or more is "positive", declines of 20 or more are "negative", otherwise "Flat".

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West Region: What percentage of District K-8 seats are utilized based on their facility age?


2017-18 District K-8 Building Utilization by Building Age



- 64% of District K-8 seats are in use, leaving approximately 1,700 empty seats in District schools in the region and roughly 500 empty charter seats. 57% of seats in new or renovated buildings are in use, while 68% of seats in buildings constructed prior to 2002 are in use.
- 28% of students attending District K-8 schools are served in buildings that are newly built since 2002, the lowest rate of any region. Five of the eight District K-8 buildings in this region pre-date 2002.
- New/renovated buildings could not serve all students forecast to attend District schools in this region in the future.

West Region: What percentage of District K-8 seats are utilized?

2017-18 District K-8 Building Age, Capacity and Utilization by 2017-18 School Locations



- There are 15 special education classrooms and six PreK classrooms in the region, which adjust capacity by 525 seats. William Rainey Harper opened in 2018-19 in the region with an additional 475 seats on top of the 1,200 open seats in existing buildings for a total of roughly 1,700 open seats in District K-8 buildings.
- Charter schools report approximately 500 empty seats.





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
West Region: Where do students reside? Ben Franklin: 45% of students reside within a mile




West Region: Where do students reside? Clark: 53% of students reside within a mile




West Region: Where do students reside? Denison: 62% of students reside within a mile




West Region: Where do students reside? Mooney: 56% of students reside within a mile




West Region: Where do students reside? TJ Newcomers: 16% of students reside within a mile

2002. Capacity will need to be addressed either through renovations or new construction to allow older buildings to be closed.

Implications 27% District students are in B or C schools. Walton is an area of focus as F, small, and in an older building.

Schools are larger in this region than most others. With **flat enrollment forecast**, consolidations may not be necessary.
