## CMSD CAREER-TECHNICAL EDUCATION (CTE) OFFERINGS AND NOTICE OF NON-DISCRIMINATION

Career-Technical Education (CTE) is educational programs and services that prepare youth for a broad range of careers that require varying levels of education, from high school, apprenticeships and postsecondary certificates to college and university degrees. These programs are designed to prepare youth for a broad range of employment and training services and are offered under the guidance of certified teachers. Programs are available in nearly all the District's high schools and are open to any interested District student, grades 9 thru 12, under the District's open enrollment policy.

The District will take steps to assure that lack of English language skills will not be a barrier to admission and participation in all CTE programs.
