
Quick Facts

The Social Impact of the Arts Project did a two year study that discovered that the relative higher presence of cultural resources in lower-income neighborhoods is linked with several health, safety, and education benefits.

- ❖ 14% decrease in indicted investigations of child abuse and neglect
- ❖ 18% decrease in felony crime rates
- ❖ 17-18% increase in the number of students scoring at the highest level on standardized tests.

<u>Survey</u>

The survey was a good choice in helping us answer our research question because we were able to find out how many people were in art programs and the majority age of people that we surveyed who are in art programs in and around the city. We wanted to find out the types of experiences people had, the thoughts people have, and what people do depending upon their environments and thoughts not directly related to art. Original we had hoped to ask our survey questions to several highschool students, a few middle school students, college students, and adults who have finished their education. However, we were only able to ask our survey questions to a few highschool students and several college students. We found out our demographic of participants through the first question on our survey which asked what age group they belonged to as well as whether or not they come/came from a low income community. We didn't ask any open ended questions although we did provide the option for people to write an answer if they felt that none of the choices suited their answer to the question. Some questions we asked were. Have you participated in an art program? Do you believe art has a positive or negative health impact? Which of the following has benefitted you in anyway?





Observation

We did an observation at NewBridge to see what kind of programs they offered as well as ask some of their teachers and students at this art center what they thought and other questions. We were able to observe the students doing ceramics and painting. Our observation took about an hour to an hour and a half. A common topic that appeared was how accepting people are in terms of LGBTQ+ and everybody.
