When celebrating with your children discuss who their heroes and leaders are in their community.


No matter how you choose to celebrate this month, it is important to recognize the contributions of Black people in America. Share stories at home with your children and use this time for learning.

Are You Using MyPowerHub?

As you know, the district does not distribute paper progress reports to parents anymore. Educators record grades through an electronic gradebook. Parents can access this gradebook through the MyPowerHub platform. Educators update grades



every 3rd, 6th and 9th week of the quarter. I urge all parents and caregivers to create their account and utilize this resource. You can track academic progress and attendance. Currently of our 36,000 students in the district, only 14% of those families have created an account. That's only around 50 families or less per school. Staff at our school will continue to encourage caregivers to create an account and use the resource as often as possible to help their scholars with their academic progress.
