

Parent Teacher Conferences!

Parent Teacher Conferences are October 29th.

Earlier in the newsletter, I mentioned Parent Teacher conferences. These are the first conferences of the year. There will 2 more conference opportunities this school year.

Parent Teacher conferences are very important 2-way conversations between parent and educator. Unfortunately, we only have a few minutes to get vital information during these meetings. So prepare before the conference by talking to your child about their progress and any struggles they maybe experience; because we should never be

blindsided by what we hear during the conference.

Spend your time with the educator asking questions like "how can I best support my scholar at home?" or "do I need any extra materials at home to help?" Keep in mind to share things about your child with the educator so that they can know more about your child. Discuss your child's strengths and weaknesses and set goals with the teacher and set goals with your child. And at the next conference, see if those goals have been met.
